### Dear People of God,

May the blessings of the Resurrection be yours not only today but always! Easter is the high point of all we do as Catholic Christians, the point toward which we yearn and make our pilgrim way from the First Sunday of Advent. It's also the energy point which impels us to go out to all nations and teach, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Of course, Easter is only part of the event we experience. It actually began last Thursday at the Liturgy of the Lord's Supper, continued through the Passion and Death of Jesus on the cross and ends today with the joyous celebration of his rising from the dead. Of course, I hope you all know that it is the death on the cross which saves us while the resurrection event is a foretaste of what we will receive if our faith is firmly placed in the crucifixion moment. Sadly, many Christians and Catholics fail to make the connection to the cross and many just don't believe that it did anything for them at all. Statistically, the second largest group of Christians in the US, after us Catholics, are the fallen away Catholics – how tragic. There have been studies which indicate that as many as two-thirds of the people reading this letter do not fully accept the divinity of Jesus so can't fathom that the cross makes a bit of difference in their lives. I'm sure that explains why even on Easter many parishes do not see all of their registered membership attend one or another of the services and many of those who do come think so little of their faith that they won't darken the doors again until next Easter. That really bothered Pope St. John-Paul II who developed a series of Wednesday Audience talks on the subject of the "new" evangelization. His goal was to excite the people who do believe to live a life so filled with the joy of Jesus risen to new life that the ordinary catholic on the street (the official term used by the church is "in the marketplace") would spark curiosity and interest in fallen away Catholics. This energetic approach to living in the faith doesn't require anyone to hit the road as a modern day street preacher but does ask that we who place our trust in the Lord do so openly and visibly so others can see that we do in fact believe. That's why I tried to fast and abstain from the Profession of Faith during Lent and occasionally invite you to do the same. When we fast and abstain it makes us think more actively about what it is we're 'giving up' or avoiding (a steak on a Friday in lent always seems to smell better and would no doubt taste better because I'm giving it up!) so that the articles of faith become something we think about rather than simply say aloud. As we proclaim today the baptismal promises, I do hope everyone will consider in a very serious way what it means and how we change our lives because we believe in one God, the Father, the Son and his death on the cross, the Spirit and the Church. Pope St. John Paul II's New Evangelization is nothing more than truly living the articles of faith, allowing them to permeate our very being so that it shows. Have a happy and joyous Easter today!





### The Celebration of Sacraments

**Infant Baptism**: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults**: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory at Historic St. Patrick @ 419-243-6452.

**Penance**: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony**: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick**: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


