Dear People of God,

I was recently asked whether I ought to make a rule that people going to Communion follow a single protocol since it may be surprising to see someone kneel and risk tripping the person behind them. The USCCB did promote a single protocol way back when all the changes of II Vatican Council were being introduced. It was not a new way to go to Communion but a return to the ancient practice of the early Church. The protocol asked the communicant to approach the altar (not the altar rail) standing, place the palm of one hand over the other to 'make a throne for the Divine Person Jesus Christ' and then pick up the host and place it on the tongue. In a sense, this duplicates the actions of the Last Supper when Jesus handed bread (note the word use of the bread being transmitted by hand) to the disciples who took it in hand and ate it. Over time the distribution of the Eucharist moved away from that simple handing around the divine substance and the host or piece of bread was placed on the tongue by the priest. This wasn't a theological decision, but one made by the necessities of a world in which people worked with their hands and often came to Mass without having thoroughly cleaned them. They may have been in the barnyard settling a new lamb, or in the garden digging the potatoes which were that Sunday's offering to the parish, or in the outhouse taking care of other and even less mentionable business. Over another span of time taking the Eucharist on the tongue developed its own mistaken piety of unworthiness, the idea that none of us is worthy to actually hold Jesus in our hands. In the 1960's many bishops began considering that the mouth and tongue are often the source of far greater unworthiness due to gossip, slander, hateful words, cursing and such it seems even less worthy to take the host on the tongue! They asked Rome for an opinion and at the sessions of II Vatican the bishops and church sought to return to the golden era of the Church's beginnings: take Jesus in your hands. However, let's be honest, change (which is the only constant, by the way) is something nobody likes so very often rather than change we continue to do it the way we always did regardless of the guidance of those who are our spiritual leaders. And once we begin to do it our way we don't hesitate to make it our personal way so that a wide variety of pious practices surround Communion time and many people, including priests who demand a particular way of coming to Communion, have gone so far as to invent a theology substantiating that particular practice. An example is the erroneous notion that taking the host on the tongue is being fed by Jesus. There is no such theological teaching of the Church but people insist. Rather than demand obedience the church has said that these various ways of communicating are all acceptable even if not desirable. The preferred way is to take the host in the palm of the hand and with the other hand pick it up and put the host in one's mouth. Since all of these ways of going to communion are allowed we must all be watchful of those in front of us whose piety may well be different than is our own. It's a sign of our respect and love for the other person that moves us to be aware and supportive.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Health News from the Parish Nurse for April 8, 2018

What Is Advance Care Planning? Advance care planning involves learning about the types of decisions that might need to be made, considering those decisions ahead of time, and then letting others know—both your family and your healthcare providers—about your preferences. These preferences are often put into an *advance directive*, a legal document that goes into effect only if you are incapacitated and unable to speak for yourself. This could be the result of disease or severe injury—no matter how old you are. It helps others know what type of medical care you want. An advance directive also allows you to express your values and desires related to end-of-life care. You might think of it as a living document—one that you can adjust as your situation changes because of new information or a change in your health. **National Health Care Decisions Day is Monday, April 16, 2018.**
