Dear People of God,

I get a lot of questions about Pope Francis from people who get their news from the popular media which tends to be somewhat biased against the Catholic Church and therefore 'reports' the news the way they want to rather than the way facts sometimes dictate it ought to be reported. In point of actual facts, Francis was the overwhelming choice of the bishops walled up inside the Sistine chapel for the election five years ago. As faithful Catholics it is our belief and our trust that the election of a pope is always under the supervision of the Holy Spirit so the overwhelming vote of the bishops reflects the overwhelming movement of the Spirit through our Church. Often God does things in ways we don't understand and perhaps don't even like and Francis seems to have been on the forefront of seeing the church in a way God does but we might not. For example, for some time the church has been slowly but surely moving toward a more inclusive notion of how God works to effect the salvation of souls. You can hear this Sunday morning in the Eucharistic Prayers especially in the petition for the dead which always includes a mention of 'Those who have died in your friendship'. Pius XII, St. John XXIII, Blessed Paul VI, St. John Paul II, Benedict XVII and now Francis have all been busy making amends and mending fences between the Catholic Church and other Christian denominations and between the Church and non-Christian ecclesial communities. Part of this is the realization that God calls people as God wills to all people, not as any of us or even the Church commands that people be called. Of course, we also believe and teach that the fullness of faith resides in the Catholic Church so should live in a way that helps others see that truth and perhaps come along for the journey of faith in the Catholic Church. We are long past the time in history when a sword or a gun can force people, to convert, it is our lives lived in the love and mercy of Jesus which will bring about conversion. Francis takes it on the chin for his openness to God's moving through other religious groups but it's an old story given a new perspective. The Holy Father is also being misconstrued over his approach to the divorced and remarried. He has said several times that the church should be welcoming and hospitable to those who divorced and the, without getting an annulment, remarried. In a sense that's new because a lot of pastors (priests and bishops) took it on themselves to illegally 'excommunicate' the divorced and remarried, banning them from any participation in the Church whatsoever. Excommunication can only be used if there's a formal trial first so no one is thrown out of the church today for anything short of actively procuring an abortion or attempting to kill the pope! Francis did not say, as the popular media suggests that pastors ought to be looking for clandestine ways to permit the divorced and remarried to receive communion, but he did say we ought to explain the rule a little better so people understand the rule. He also urges us to do everything we can to incorporate the divorced and remarried in their ministerial work of the church so that they can feel a part of Jesus' work and move whatever way possible toward regularizing their married state. Francis also revised the processes for getting an annulment which can help people find their way back to full participation in the sacraments much more expeditiously.

The Celebration of Sacraments


Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
