#### Dear People of God,

Last Sunday I mentioned excommunication and that always rouses a lot of interesting questions, like why doesn't the church excommunicate that so-and-so who votes against pro-life every chance he gets? Let me explain what excommunication is and how one finds him or herself in that condition. According to Church Law, penalties arise from two sources: 1) those imposed after a formal process and 2) those incurred automatically. The Law goes on to state that "penalties are to be established only so far as they are necessary for the better maintenance of ecclesiastical discipline." Any legislator can enact penal laws, but the Law says "he is not, however, to constitute censures, especially excommunication, except with the greatest moderation, and only for the more grave offenses." In case you haven't been following, the church is in the reconciliation business so handing out penalties is supposed to be a last resort for the worst situations. So then, let's get to excommunication. You might be surprised to learn that it does *not* throw somebody out of the Church. It does forbid the person to hold an office in the church, or exercise any ministry, or receive the sacraments. In order to impose excommunication there has to be a formal process. That begins with a charge being levied by somebody who has the authority to make a charge. That means the ordinary person in the pew can't charge anyone with a crime big enough to include excommunication as a potential penalty. That's because we're all in the reconciliation business, not the condemnation business. Once a charge is made somebody has to determine whether the person is actually chargeable and there are numerous reasons in the church why somebody is not since we're in the reconciliation business. If the person can be charged, there has to be a court set up, witnesses called, testimonies taken and then a judgment after the various representatives have a chance to make their final arguments. The judgment is supposed to make the smallest possible penalty since we're in the reconciliation business so excommunication would be rare. And what about the automatic sentence of excommunication where the punishment fits the crime? These are really rare. Clerics (bishops, priests and deacons) can be automatically excommunicated for heresy, schism and apostasy. Anyone who steals a host for some sort of sacrilegious purpose is automatically excommunicated. Others include: attempting to kill or killing the pope; a bishop who consecrates a priest to be a bishop without the mandate of the Holy See; a priest absolving a partner in a sin against the sixth commandment of the Decalogue; a priest who violates the seal of confession. It's a pretty short list. The list of crimes for which excommunication could be charged and a trial held is equally short both because nobody wants to have a big protected trial and few people would be found guilty given the many, many reasons people aren't guilty of that big an offense. We may think they're guilty, but the real question to be asked is does God? God is merciful and forgiving and desires not the death of the sinner, but his conversion.







#### Health News from the Parish Nurse

Advance Care Planning. Making Your Wishes Known. There are two main elements in an advance directive—a living will and a durable power of attorney for health care.

Living will. A living will is a written document that helps you tell doctors how you want to be treated if you are dying or permanently unconscious and cannot make your own decisions about emergency treatment. In a living will, you can say which procedures you would want, which ones you wouldn't want, and under which conditions each of your choices applies. Durable power of attorney for health care. A durable power of attorney for health care is a legal document naming a healthcare proxy, someone to make medical decisions for you at times when you are unable to do so. Your proxy, also known as a representative, surrogate, or agent, should be familiar with your values and wishes. This means that he or she will be able to decide as you would when treatment decisions need to be made. A proxy can be chosen in addition to or instead of a living will. Advance Care Planning. Selecting Your Healthcare **Proxy.** If you decide to choose a proxy, think about people you know who share your views and values about life and medical decisions. Your proxy might be a family member, a friend, your lawyer, or someone in your social or spiritual community. It's a good idea to also name an alternate proxy. It is especially important to have a detailed living will if you choose not to name a proxy. You can decide how much authority your proxy has over your medical care—whether he or she is entitled to make a wide range of decisions or only a few specific ones. Try not to include guidelines that make it impossible for the proxy to fulfill his or her duties. Of course, check with those you choose as your healthcare proxy and alternate before you name them officially. Make sure they are comfortable with this responsibility.
