Dear People of God,

We're already busy recruiting people for our next bible study series. Take time to look into it as what God reveals in the bible is worth knowing. Among the revelations which sometimes upsets people is the authorship of the various works which came to be included in the bible. The bible was written, every word, every punctuation mark, every sentence, by ordinary human beings. That means it includes what the particular author wanted in there and may indicate that the author was a poor speller and a worse grammeratician (which word must mean I'm a bad vocabularist since the word is underlined in red so must be misspelled or something). Each author was motivated by something going on in the community which demanded attention and seeks to provide answers, guidance, warnings or some other bit of information for consumption by the people for whom the work was composed. Each book of the bible is, therefore, fully human in its origins and reflects the very personal biases of whoever wrote it. However, because God also had some ideas to get across, all of those books, regardless of their errors of history, geography, names, places or whatever, are inspired by the Holy Spirit to reveal truth. The truth being revealed is not necessarily about the geography of the Holy Land, but uses the geography as the author understood it (Luke's sense of the map is usually upside down) to reveal something about God's relationship with humanity. For example, one of the great thematic ideas running all through the Old Testament is the famous (and still on-going) debate over whether to live in the city or the country. Obviously, if the author lived in town he took a personal approach which favored the city while the farmer was of the mind that everybody was better off in the country. You can see this in the Cain and Able story, the Tower of babel, Abraham and Lot, the decision by God not to let David build a temple and a host of other places. While the argument is still not resolved (right now it seems that the city is winning because of the resurgence of the down town here in Toledo), the argument is used by the Holy Spirit to reveal all kinds of things about God and us, about where to worship and how to live peacefully with others wherever they might be. Another developmental theme of the Old Testament is the way humanity comes to terms with sin, why it sexists and who's responsible. The great insight, which occurs fairly late in the overall composition of the Old Testament, clearly states that sin is the fault of the sinner and can't be blamed on anyone else. The New Testament goes even farther than that and slowly but surely gets to the point where God reveals that we're responsible for the damage done when we choose to sin. There's much more you can learn by getting involved in a bible study group, things that simply reading the texts without guidance will never reveal. Real knowledge of the bible and its richer meaning comes from people working together, listening to the Holy Spirit and perhaps discovering that there's more to the story than anyone ever suspected.




