Dear People of God,

Every now and then someone comes up after Mass to ask a question which seems to me to require a broader response than the one I provide. I mean to say that the question is so good it deserves to be shared with the parish at large. So, somebody asked me why the Church still has a Tridentine Mass (the Latin Mass required universally by the Council of Trent in the late 1500's) when the Second Vatican Council said we ought to be striving for *full, conscious, and active participation* by celebrating the Mass in the vernacular or the common languages of the people who go to Mass. The simple answer to that is to quote the fourth general principle of the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, promulgated by Pope Paul VI on 4 December 1963: *in faithful obedience to tradition, the sacred Council declares that Holy Mother Church holds all lawfully acknowledged rites to be of equal right and dignity; that she wishes to preserve them in the future and to foster them in every way [...] where necessary, the rites be revised carefully in the light of sound tradition, and that they be given new vigor to meet circumstances and needs of modern man.* The Council then stated clearly that Latin was to be preserved as the primary language of the Latin rite church, the church we call the Roman Catholic Church but where it seemed appropriate to foster *full, conscious and active participation*, the various parts of the Mass could be translated into the vernacular. When the Roman Missal was translated into English it became obvious that the ritual was larded with far too many repetitions which did not contribute to full, conscious, and active participation. There were numerous 'secret prayers' which the celebrant whispered and which were unknown to the people in the pew who were reciting the rosary to keep busy until Communion time. That led to the *Novus ordo*, the new ritual Mass of Pius VI with which all of us are familiar since that's the one we use today. Repetitions were eliminated, secret prayers either eliminated or at least reduced in number and the calendar changed to focus on a smaller number of more important saints and festival days. For most Catholics that was fine, the Mass was now something they could understand and in which they could more actively participate since it invited the people in the pew to do just that. However, change, while it is the only constant in the universe, is difficult so there were a few bishops at the Council who felt that John XXIII had gone too far calling the Council and that the assembled bishops had gone too far in submitting any number of the documents of the council for papal approval, among them the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy. Those bishops were vocal and insisted that the Tridentine Mass was the only real Mass and exerted pressure to maintain its celebration. While trumpeting the excellence of the Mass of Trent they overlooked that the Roman Missal of Pope Pius V had been revised repeated between the time of Pius and John XXIII whose 1962 edition remains the Tridentine Mass celebrated in so-called Latin parishes. Pius V mandated the Roman Missal universally (with some exceptions for places that were using a Mass ritual older than 1370) in 1570 and revised it a Year later to include a festival day honoring Our Lady of Victory to mark the Battle of Lepanto. That's a key day for us here in Toledo as it later became the memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary. The Roman Missal was revised in 1604, 1634, 1884, 1911/1920, 1955 and 1962 so technically there's nothing sacrosanct about it. Other revisions are sure to follow.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.



Sleep and Health. What Schools Can Do (continued): Review School Start Times. The combination of late bedtimes and early school start times results in most adolescents not getting enough sleep. In recent years, evidence has accumulated that later school start times for adolescents result in more students getting enough sleep. School officials can learn more about the research connecting sleep and school start times. School districts can support adequate sleep among students by implementing delayed school start times as recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP), the American Medical Association, and the American Academy of Sleep Medicine.
