Dear People of God,

Last week I mentioned the Roman Missal of Pius V and its many revisions. Pope Pius V did for the Missal what the Second Vatican Council did; he excised a lot of saints days that had accumulated over the years in order to focus more on the Mass itself and less on people who may have done great things but had not managed to do things greater than Jesus' gift of the Eucharist. He also simplified the flow of the Mass so that it resonated with what was being celebrated, God's sacrifice on the Cross and the institution of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. As I mentioned, he permitted the celebration of really ancient rites where they had been in place for over 200 years. A few remained over the centuries, the rite of St. Ambrose in Milan and the Mozarabic in Toledo, Spain (this rite dates to sometime before 633 when the Fourth Council of Toledo formally adopted it for the Hispanic peoples. It is still used daily in the Chapel of the Body of Christ, Madrid and for special feast days in the Archdiocese of Toledo). The 1962 revision by St. John Paul XXIII has been attacked by some Latinists because it trimmed the number of saints days being celebrated and shortened or deleted a number of prayers and repetitions the Holy Father and the commission for liturgical texts felt were unnecessary to the principle purpose of the Mass: the celebration of the Eucharist. All of the wrangling over which of the revised Roman Missals ought to be used if the older tradition was to be followed led to the formation of splinter groups within the Church. In an attempt to provide some clear rules and expectations, Benedict XVI issued a decree "on his own initiative" called *Summorum pontificum* which reviewed some of the history and then set out the rules and expectations. A few of the more important ones are: a) the use of the old rite is to be permitted where the people of God ask for it; b) the bishop may establish a stable parish where the old rite may be celebrated; c) any priest may use the old rite in a private Mass (which is reprobated by canon 906 with due regard for the "good and reasonable" causes mentioned in canon 930). So, after all of that the answer to the question about the Tridentine Mass is a little more complicated but boils down to a couple of key considerations: the ancient tradition of the Church, in this case the ancient being the Roman Missal of John XXIII in light of the decrees of the Second Vatican Council that Latin remain a guiding force in the West and the desire of a part of the people of God to make use of the Latin rite. Here in Toledo the traditional Latin Mass is celebrated every Sunday at St. Joseph parish on North Erie Street and periodically on other days of the week. It is now and then celebrated at other parishes but must always be celebrated by a priest who knows what he's doing since the flow of the Mass is different and calls for a lot of ritual movement with which many are unfamiliar. The celebrant should also have a good working knowledge of Latin so he knows what he's saying as he prays the various prayers of the Mass. With the convenience of the stable parish, the use of the Tridentine Mass at other parishes here in the city has diminished although the use of Latin has not. The Kyrie (which is actually Greek), Gloria, Alleluia (which is actually Hebrew), Sanctus, and Angus Dei are all familiar Latin parts of the Mass we all know and hopefully love when they are sung in our parishes as they are a universal proclamation of our universal Church.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Health News from the Parish Nurse for July 29, 2018

Sleep and Health. What Parents Can Do.

- Model and encourage habits that help promote good sleep. Setting a regular bed-time and rise time, including on weekends, is recommended for everyone—children, adolescents, and adults alike. Adolescents with parent-set bedtimes usually get more sleep than those whose parents do not set bed-times.
- Dim lighting. Adolescents who are exposed to more light (such as room lighting or from electronics) in the evening are less likely to get enough sleep.
- Implement a media curfew. Technology use (computers, video gaming, or mobile phones) may also contribute to late bed-times. Parents should consider banning technology use after a certain time or removing these technologies from the bedroom.
