### The Celebration of Sacraments

**Infant Baptism**: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. **Penance**: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony**: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

## Health News from the Parish Nurse August 19, 2018

Know Your Options. Talk to your doctor about ways to manage your pain that do not involve prescription opioids. Some of these options may actually work better and have fewer risks and side effects. Depending on the type of pain you are experiencing, options may include: 1) Acetaminophen (Tylenol®) or ibuprofen (Advil®). 2) Cognitive behavioral therapy – a psychological, goal-directed approach in which patients learn how to modify physical, behavioral, and emotional triggers of pain and stress. 3) Exercise therapy, including physical therapy. 4) Medications for depression or seizures. 5) Interventional therapies (injections). 6) Exercise and weight loss. 7) Other therapies such as acupuncture and massage.






## Report of Finances, Fiscal Year 2017-2018

This past year has been truly blessed as we celebrate the sesquicentennial of Immaculate Conception. Ours has never been a wealthy parish, her membership consists of good, hardworking men and women, many of whom were and are first generation Americans eager to make their way. As the following will show, we have been able to enhance our income streams thanks to the generous parishioners who made a pledge to increase their Sunday offerings.. All of us should be filled with gratitude for those who so regularly support the parish and its activities and perhaps those of us who do not currently contribute regularly might begin to do so in order to share the burden and blessing of stewardship more equitably.




Parish income this past year totaled \$168,581. As the graph above indicates, the largest income stream, and therefore the one the parish counts on most, was regular Sunday offerings, a total of \$116,367. Parish activities, in the main the Reverse Raffle, brought the parish \$29,166. Christmas and Easter realized \$8,088. Gifts and a few small items like transfers of stipend funds, wedding fees and the like make up the balance.

Income reached a level that we could begin to repay the accounts set aside for parking lots and other improvements, which had been depleted during the hard times of years past when Sunday offerings failed to hit our budget goals. Those goals are established by the Finance/Facilities Committee based on two factors: previous levels of giving and anticipated ordinary expenses. Over the past year there have been no on-going special collections in hopes that ordinary giving would increase and meet the needs, both immediate and future, of the parish. Thanks to all who stepped up to the plate and made that happen. May God bless your generosity many times over.



The above chart represents \$161,432 in expenses. As the chart indicates, there are two rather large areas of expense for which the parish must find adequate funds. The largest is the maintenance of our aging campus which required spending \$59,785. The salaries of our employees which totaled \$47,786, is the second largest area of expense, with an additional \$12,640 for taxes and fringe benefits. Coming in at third is a category referred to as *operations* and which includes all the things required to make sure we can celebrate Mass and other liturgical and educational services. Administration, a total of \$14,929, includes the cost of supplies, all the inserts in the bulletin and other things we need to make sure the bathrooms are




clean, the floors polished. Those other expenses refers to the payments we make to the diocese for insurance, health care, retirement and the general assessment made to assist with the work of the diocese.

In the area of Administration are the various expenses required to maintain our office, print up bulletin inserts and other materials, maintain phone and internet service, stay connected to diocesan services and replace aging or damaged equipment. As can be seen,

keeping printers, computers and copiers running is a major cost item.
