Dear People of God,

As often happens, when I write a letter for the bulletin somebody finds cause to come with another related question. Last week I discussed the different translations of the bible and that led to a follow-up as to who wrote the various books, with a more fundamentalist approach being God wrote every last word. As far as we know, Jesus, God, never set pen to paper and the Father and the Spirit would have deferred to Jesus' human capacities if either had wanted to write a book of the bible or the whole thing. Many of the books of the bible are called by their very human authors, Jeremiah, Isaiah, Matthew, Mark, St. Paul, St. James and others. The authors, even of the books which have some other name, like Genesis, Kings, Wisdom, Acts, also had ordinary human authors. Each writer had an idea, no doubt planted by their relationships with God, to address some pressing need or concern of the community for which they composed their work. While they sat at the desk composing chapter and verse the Holy Spirit inspired them to include in their writing the truths that God wishes to reveal to us, his faithful disciples, truths about God, God's relationship with humanity and the relationship to which he calls humanity to share with God in that future unity of the Kingdom. The truths are theological so very often the non-theological component of a gospel or book might be full of factual errors, like the geography of Luke which has little to do with the actual geography of the Holy land but everything to do with the Mission and Ministry of Jesus which is the real reason behind the gospel. We should keep in mind that the books of the bible are meant to be a bible, not history or political science or biography. They may include aspects of those other sciences, but that is not why they were written and not how they should be read. That's why the church has always said that reading the bible, while a great individual activity, should always and ever be bolstered by involvement in some kind of broader study, a bible study group, a good commentary, a wholesome video presentation or some other device which helps to bring out the richer theological sense of the various works of the bible. Any of these additional helps are put together by scholars who know the history, the languages, the political and social environment and a whole lot more than any of us as individuals might know so that we can gain a better insight into what God wanted us to learn from the various books. The Church also warns us to beware of bible study which focuses on particular snippets without providing some sense of where the snippet fits into the whole since any of the books is meant to be a untied piece of work, not individual elements meant to be parsed and taken out of context. Sure, we can read a chapter at a time, but we ought to begin at the beginning and move forward so we can get a sense of the flow and purpose of the whole rather than leap to conclusions based on only partial understanding.






