Dear People of God

Slowly but surely, hopefully before the Solemnity of All Saints, we're tackling the question about is it a sin to miss a Holy Day mass. Last week I addressed Liturgy and today I want to expand a little and touch on the Liturgical Year. As I'm sure everyone knows human beings have been celebrating the year (365 days) for longer than anyone knows for certain. The Greek historian Herodotus wrote that the Egyptians had a history which reflected ten thousand years. Our own calendar marks out 2018 years since a major event occurred in the Near The Church also maintains an annual calendar and, like any other calendar, it has a few special days marked out. Most cultures celebrate New Year's Day. For a lot of us that's January 1, but for other cultures it's set not by the movement of the earth around the sun, but by the movement of the moon around the earth so in China and much of Asia it's somewhere between the middle of January and the middle of February. We celebrate Independence Day on July 4 but in Mexico it's September 16. Years are different depending on whose calendar we're looking at. The Church keeps a calendar with special days and even special seasons that might or might not parallel Summer Fall Winter Spring (Howdy Doody fans will recognize the name). The days and seasons enjoy an historical sense of value, with some days and seasons more important than others so that the Liturgy would be different on those days and in those seasons. Most of us should have lived through enough Church years to know that New Year's Day is the First Sunday of Advent (count back from Christmas on December 25 four Sundays and there you are). Advent is a festive season of patient waiting. It's a time to celebrate the rich history of the people of God who did some real waiting before Jesus was born, which is what Christmas is all about. Because it's liturgy, the entire year has movement involved, and the movement is either toward or away from the Easter Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil). In general there is a period of building up to the great celebration of salvation and then, following the Easter Vigil a lowering of the level of celebration as we move toward the Solemnity of Christ the King (the Sunday before the First Sunday of Advent). This movement is suggested by the events of salvation history being commemorated and celebrated. Noting rises to a greater height than does the Easter Vigil which should be the grandest and best attended celebration of the Catholic year. The music should be spectacular and nothing at any other Mass should compare. Decorations at the Vigil should be the grandest and most provocative of faith during the entire year. The participation of the assembly should be designed to be greater and more intense than at any other celebration of the entire year. The transformation of the believers at the Vigil should be as life-giving as they are for the men and women being baptized and reborn into the life and Mission of Jesus. All other days should in a sense pale in comparison to what the believers experience at the Vigil ceremonies. And the liturgical year might draw its thematic expression from some aspect of the Easter Vigil celebrations.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
