Dear People of God

I think I can get down to whether going to Mass on a Holy day is a sin or not in another few weeks! This week I want to address the whole theology of sin as we understand it in a modern context. Sin is to follow the lead of Adam and Eve and disobey God. All sin since the original version reported in Genesis is disobedience of one kind or another. Most sin can be seen as disobedience of one or the other of the two commands God gave: 1) love God and 2) love your neighbor as you love yourself. For example, if you steal something you're disobeying the first command because it was God who told you not to steal but you're also disobeying the second command because you're harming your neighbor. In the halcyon days of the Baltimore Catechism, developing a theme of a lot of scholastic philosophers, there were two categories of sinfulness: mortal and venial. Mortal sinfulness was anything which was so evil, so disobedient that it entirely destroyed the relationship between the sinner and God or the sinner and his/her neighbor. The act carried out created a permanent rift between the sinner and God and/or neighbor. The Church made it easy to determined whether the act was that evil: 1) it had to be well-established in the community to be that evil in and of itself which means I can't decide on my own but must look to the collective wisdom of those better versed in moral behaviors, 2) the one undertaking the act had to know (before hand and in the moment) that the act was that evil, and 3) the one undertaking the act had to do so with deliberation which means thinking through the evil itself and the negative consequences to self, others and relationship with God and doing it despite knowing only evil will result. A venial sin was defined disobedience which didn't meet the criteria for a mortal sin which means doing harm to others or to God perhaps without knowing just how bad that harm would be or which damages relationships but does not utterly destroy them. Today the emphasis on mortal and venial has been replaced by a much more nuanced sense of how much evil was perpetrated or let loose by one's disobedient actions. Sin might better be perceived as a spectrum from not so bad to very bad to totally bad depending on how the disobedience reflects our approach to and respect for the God who gave those two commands and our desire to do as we please regardless of how it might affect others and God. All of this depends on a) what we know, b) what we do knowing what we know, c) why we do what we do and d) how what we do affects others, be it God or God's people or God's creation. Sin is not something that can be pinned on anyone since the knowledge and the motivation are entirely interior to the person unless that person blabs to somebody before or during the act which would be a confession to sinning. Most people don't do that so sin has to be the movement within the conscience awakening the actor to a particular action which has caused harm to others and the extent to which that act was undertaken with deliberation. You might conclude that it's really difficult to commit a sin, but it's not really, it's just easy to rationalize that what we do isn't a sin because . . (and that may be a yet greater sin since it harms anyone thinking that way).

The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Health Information from the Parish Nurse for October 7, 2018

Action Planning: Breaking Down Health Goals into Manageable Steps. What Are Action Plans? Action plans, created jointly by healthcare providers and patients, spell out small and realistic steps the patient is planning to take to address a health goal. In addition to making changes to diets and physical activity routines, action plans can be used for a wide variety of goals-including stopping smoking, reducing stress, and improving sleep habits. Research has shown that a majority of patients who made an action plan in a primary care site reported making an associated behavior change. By transforming behavior change discussions with patients, action planning presents an opportunity to achieve concrete progress on health promotion goals.
