Dear People of God,

Over the past several weeks, having considered what a sin is, what the Church is, and how the Catholic Church functions over the Liturgical year; we return to the question that inspired these explorations: Is it a sin to miss Mass on the Solemnity of the Assumption (or any other Holy Day of obligation)? The most profound answer to that question is “maybe.” We would have to examine several different realities to decide either that it is or it isn’t because there are a lot of different realities which come together in all the subjects we’ve discussed since this question arose. For a starter, we should know that the Church is confessional, and that when we say “I believe . . .” it binds us to a contract of faith in Jesus and his Church, a Church which can and does make rules and regulations about what constitutes wholesome and productive membership. Those rules and regulations are not meant to sit out there as impediments to our getting into heaven; rather, they serve as reminders of what it takes to claim to be a Catholic, let alone be one. Being Catholic means doing ‘Catholic things’ and among the behavioral traits which mark a Catholic is celebrating the Church as the people of God, the Body of Christ. The ordinary way to celebrate is at the liturgies of the church where the people of God come together to sing God’s praises, celebrate God’s Word and share in the very presence of God in the Eucharist. A body can’t be a body without all of its parts assembled into a cohesive unity, a living, breathing being - and that goes for the Church as well. As a confessional Church, the Catholic Ecclesial Community has determined that all professed Catholics must join with the body of believers on a regular basis, no less than every Sunday and on the appointed Holy Days. Failure to do so harms the individual (by denying him or her the salvific Word and Sacrament available at the celebration), other believers (by denying them the companionship and prayerful support of the one absent), the Universal Church (by excising an important member of the whole) and the community (by giving false witness as to what one believes). Where harm occurs, there can be sin and the gravity of that sin depends on who is harmed and to what extent. Of course, the Church is in the forgiveness business so it understands that there are often extenuating circumstances which exonerate the individual from being in a state of sin. One of these is ignorance, but does anyone who claims to be Catholic really not know at all that a Holy Day is a Holy day and we’re expected to join other believers at Mass? Another extenuating circumstance is availability of the celebration. The Church does not expect us to risk our lives to be at Mass, so if work, illness, distance, time, or some other factor intervenes which makes it really, really difficult to be there, then there could be no sin involved. So, is it a sin to miss Mass on the Assumption? Only the individual who wasn’t there can decide that and should do so based on the importance of the community and of giving God due worship and adoration together with that community.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
