Dear People of God,

Recently the lectionary reading from Paul's letter to the Galatians asked: "People of Galatia, have you been bewitched?" It seemed particularly relevant since we've been seeing all kinds of Halloween decorations, the store shelves are filled with a selection of candies, and the big box stores are all selling costumes. All Hallows Eve is the formal vigil of All Saints, the Holy Day inserted in the Church's calendar near the end of the Liturgical year to celebrate those who have died ahead of us and have gone into the Kingdom of God. As with most such festival days, All Saints was layered into already existing celebrations of other (usually very pagan) religions in order to accomplish two ends. The first was to show that the pagan festival was an attempt to grasp what God fully reveals in the Catholic Church. St. Paul commented on this when he wrote: you see dimly as in a mirror, but now see Jesus Christ fully. The second reason was to eliminate older practices by providing a rich, meaningful celebration of Jesus and his Church. Holy Days became extravagant celebrations with festive music, grand processions, guest homilists and often a big meal where the people gathered to rejoice in the blessings God had given them as highlighted by the particular Holy Day. We know it isn't easy to change: people don't like change, and not everybody does change so that some of the old ways remain and can become a contrary custom. I saw this in one of my former assignments where a nearby church had been founded by a fallen away Catholic who wanted to be a bible-based preacher. He couldn't change himself 100% so during Lent, he had the Stations of the Cross and prayed the Liturgy of the Hours morning and evening with some of the people in his otherwise very fundamental church. We all may know that All Hallows Eve retained some of the more ancient sense of the spirits of the dead coming back to visit the living. Because most people were afraid of the dead (the Romans burned their dead to avoid having ghosts come back to visit), the spirits who returned on the night before All Saints were usually the evil spirts of people who weren't going to be celebrated among the saints the following day. Thus we have costumes of monsters, the devil and other evil personalities, recently from a variety of horror films. Many people condemn Halloween for celebrating evil, but perhaps we might want to stop and give thanks that God has triumphed over evil and we have nothing to fear from it as long as we adhere to our faith.

The commercialization of Halloween may cause us to forget that it is actually All Hallows Eve, the night before All Saints Holyday (this Thursday, Nov 1) and well-timed to finish answering the question about whether it's a sin to miss mass on a Holyday. One other issue merits consideration: the simple term "Obligation." To be obliged simply means the one obliged has no choice in the matter: the requirement is a must. In the Catholic Church certain obligations arise from the seven sacraments so that if we accept/receive one or another, we must behave or do something in a prescribed way. At baptism we accept the salvation earned for us by Jesus' death on the cross. The obligations of the sacrament fall on parents and Godparents if the one baptized is a child under seven, and after that the obligations fall on the one baptized. The Church presumes that by the key age of seven, the so-called age of reason, people are smart enough to know what things mean and what they ought to be doing because they desire and accept a sacrament. The essential obligation of baptism is to learn everything we can about the savior Jesus Christ, his work and ministry, and the salvation won for us on the cross. If we celebrate the baptism of an infant at Mass, listen closely to hear that obligation mentioned in the blessings at the end of the ceremony: may they be teachers of their child(ren) in the ways of faith. At Confirmation the one being sealed by the Holy Spirit assumes other obligations, among them to practice the faith at the minimum level at which one can claim to be practicing the faith. The Church teaches that many behaviors are obligations, musts for the committed Catholic who celebrates Confirmation. Not least among these is the obligation to form the Body of Christ with other believers on a regular basis and to be nourished at the table of the Lord's Last Supper; the Church has officially taught for nearly a thousand years that "regular basis" means every Sunday when the Church celebrates the sacred Triduum (last supper, death and resurrection) in the ceremony of the Mass as well as on a number of important days which recall the significant events in our own salvation (like looking forward to forming the body of Christ with the other saints when we get to heaven). The obligation is very real and that's why the Church asks if people really want to be confirmed because once they are, it doesn't go away. Remember what God said: I'll be your God, you'll be my people; if we accept that relationship, it's forever. You can walk away from the obligations but the obligations will never walk away from you; they're serious, calling on us to live out our confession of faith which leads to the seven sacraments and the musts associated with each of them. Failing to do so weakens the whole body and causes grave harm whether we realize it or not.

All Souls Day, the day after All Saints Day, is this Friday; we will pause to remember all who have died and await the second coming of Jesus the Christ. At our parish we take time to commemorate those who left our community over the past twelve months. At the funeral we place a memento on the casket or near the cremains. It's inscribed with the name of the deceased and the person's birth and death date. These mementos are placed in the church until All Souls day as a reminder to all of us that just because someone has passed from this life to the next, each remains very much a part of our praying community. Before the celebration of All Souls passes, you might want to take a look at those plaques and say a prayer of thanks for what those men and women did for the parish and what their intercession can help us accomplish in the future. You might also wish to attend the special Mass when we invite families to return and take home their own plaque as a reminder that their loved one remains very much part of the parish.




