

Dear People of God,

The Christmas Season is all too brief and ends with the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord. In part that's due to the liturgical sequence of events which hi-lite salvation history; however, it's also due to the fact that we know very little of Jesus' childhood and youth. The gospels record only that at some time in his early childhood three wise ones from the East came in to worship and bring gifts, he and his family lived for a time in Egypt awaiting the death of Herod the Great who was desperate to kill him, and he was back in Nazareth by the age of 12 and visited the Temple with Mary and Joseph. From 12 to 30 we have no accurate references although you can find a lot of interesting and fantastical material in the writings of the early Church which was anxious to fill in the gaps and didn't mind making up a few things. Because his childhood, adolescence and early adulthood did not encompass the major events of salvation history they were not considered apt to the four gospels. That doesn't mean he wasn't doing things, though. No doubt he was busy proclaiming the love of the Father to anyone he met. Certainly he was about the business of giving appropriate honor to both Mary his biological mother and Joseph the stand-in father appointed by God to provide a lot of good, practical fatherly advice. We can easily imagine he had friends and spent time with them doing what young people do because as a fully human person Jesus would have wanted to experience all of the joys and sorrows of growing up. You know, we paint an overly pious image of Jesus so often forget that in his era there was no Degree anti-perspirant and people smelled interesting after a few hours following the bath (the Jews had learned regular bathing from the Romans so we can imagine Jesus' bathed fairly regularly). We ought to think that he had tastes and preferences like any of us, perhaps disliking his green vegetables as much as some of us do. People back then didn't wear fancy shoes and relied on thin leather sandals to ward off the heat of the sun shining on sand (I saw several pair in the Dead Sea Scrolls exhibits at the Library of Congress and then at the City Museum of Grand Rapids – they were about as thin as a penny and tied in place with thongs also of leather – they didn't look comfortable at all) so most people wore them only if absolutely necessary (which is why statues of the saints of that era are usually shown barefoot). We might also consider that Jesus now and then suffered the typical cold and flu that affect all human beings. I would think he may have been bullied and I base that on the Shroud of Turin which indicates he would have been around six feet tall, unsulky tall for anyone of that era, and we all know that any kid at school who's different is usually pointed out as being different! We should certainly never imagine that, like the infant in the crèche, he gave the Apostolic Blessing (the sign of the cross) because that particular blessing doesn't come into being until after his death and resurrection. While we know very little from the gospels we do know a lot from life. Jesus was one of us because he loved us and wanted to be like us. He didn't use his divinity to hide from his humanity or to set it aside when it was uncomfortable. He embraced it fully, the good the bad and the unpleasant. The only human activity Jesus never fell into is the penchant we have to allow sin to distract us from the good things we could be doing. So the next time you're sniffling from allergies or a head cold, think of Jesus – he probably did as well.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.







Snow Emergency

Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency during which all roadways are closed to nonemergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio or internet, making a spiritual Communion. When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in the geographic area are also cancelled.
