Dear People of God,

Mentioning changes in the funeral rite inspired a question about planning ahead. Many people pre-plan a funeral through their preferred provider (I've got everything ready for my funeral through the mortuary in Swanton where I grew up, where some high school classmates owned the place now owned by their son, and where I'll be buried). It's a great way to spare children, parents or other relatives the burden of doing all the planning when grieving seems the more necessary obligation. Most funeral homes are well qualified to assist in the grieving process and have been given ample guidance from the diocese on doing so in a way that characterizes the deceased as a member of the household of God. While most directors and their staffs are also competent to help plan the actual funeral, they will more often than not defer to the parish where the rituals will take place so that local customs and requirements of time and space can be explained and applied. As part of pre-planning, it's often thought a good idea to put together the funeral ritual itself, choosing readings and songs, setting down names of potential lectors, distributors, pall bearers and the like. Some of this tends to be fairly easy – readings from the Old Testament, New Testament and Gospels are laid out in the ritual book itself (which can be found on-line from a number of sources and most Catholic funeral homes will have them ready to hand out as would any parish). Choosing songs should reflect the place in the liturgy where any particular song would be sung so that the words enhance the experience at that point in the Mass. This is sometimes difficult in choosing music for the offertory (we're giving gifts to God) and Communion (we're getting the ultimate gift from God); however, the hymnal nicely identifies appropriate music for these two places in the liturgy. People like to pick songs they liked in this life which may or may not be what their family, friends or others would like. It's always a good idea to choose a selection and then let the family do the final choice so what they hear is a message of hope and of God's love appropriate for them. Because many children have fallen away from regular attendance at Mass, choosing familiar hymns from the more traditional area will be far more comforting than would some of the newer songs they may not recognize. Finally, pre-planning the funeral is often done without pre-planning for what will happen to all of our property when we die. I'm speaking of the Last Will and Testament we ought to have written and placed in a secure, easy-to-get-to place so that our wishes for the proper distribution of our assets can be done without a lot of second guessing by an administrator appointed by the courts. I'm sure all of us have in mind what should be done with our property and monies; it's a good idea to talk this over with the family when we do write a will so no one will be surprised. If arguing and fighting ensue, it will have taken place before we die so we can attend to any reconciliation that may have to be done; any distribution of an estate can leave a lot of raw wounds in those who expected to be treated more royally than perhaps we felt they should be. Planning ahead really does make things much easier for those who have to deal with our dying, but we should always exercise good sense and thoughtfulness in planning things the way we are.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

<u>Matrimony</u>: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.





Snow Emergency

Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio or internet, making a spiritual Communion. When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in the geographic area are also cancelled.
