Dear People of God,

A couple of weeks ago I began a series touching on some interesting quotes from the popes or sacred scripture and as was to be expected, someone read the letter and asked the question: if God will save people wherever they go to church, why be a (Roman and a couple of dozen other Churches in unpin with the Holy Father) Catholic? The questioner added a few words on how much easier some other churches have it, with cappuccino bars and big screen television so the sermon can be watched in the comfort of the lobby. Innocent had the answer to that, as have all subsequent popes and councils, right up to II Vatican Council back on the 1960's. It may seem simplistic, but here it is: That's where God has called us and in the Roman Catholic Church, as II Vatican has stated, is to be found the fullness of the truth revealed by Jesus Christ for the salvation of souls. We don't ordinarily say the whole Creed on Sunday, but now and then you'll hear it when a new pastor is installed or at the Easter Vigil when the already baptized make a Profession of Faith in the Roman Cathodic Church. What's added to the Creed is a statement that goes something like this: I believe and profess all that has been transmitted through the ages by the Magisterium of the church and taught as authentically handed down by God. That statement, which is part of what we as Catholics profess in our lives and in our actions, means we believe in what the Church has to say to us in its official capacity. Among the things it has said repeatedly is that once a Catholic always a Catholic. In essence, that teaching tells us that we have faith in Jesus Christ in its purest form, so why go elsewhere? Why abandon the clearest connections we can have with God (we have both Word and Sacrament which other denominations do not)? Certainly, the fact remains that God saves whom God saves, but if we really want to live out a genuine and committed faith, why not do it in the ecclesial community where it's most easily accomplished and in which the source of energy and life is readily available from the seven raments? Innocent would tell us that to deliberately leave that community is a serious error and a grave matter. That's why Saint John Paull II initiated a broad-based program he called the New Evangelization to go to those who were once active in the Catholic Church and who have, for whatever reason, drifted away. If we truly believe we have it the best, shy not go out and tell people, especially those who were once part of it?

The Celebration of Sacraments

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
