Dear People of God,

I want to get back to my series on scriptural and papal statements about salvation so here is number 2 from the list I was given. It's by Boniface VIII (around the year 1300) in a formal document called *Unam Sanctam: we declare, define and pronounce that is absolutely necessary for the salvation of every human creature to be subject to the Roman Pontiff*. That sounds pretty serious but, as is often the case, the context here is important to the ultimate meaning. Let me begin by saying that the original letter is long lost and only copies remain. In some of the copies this statement is not in the actual text, but is a comment scrawled in the margins, as if the reader were interpreting something Boniface had to say. Boniface was an unabashed proponent of the secular power of the popes and expended far more effort advancing territorial and secular power claims than he did on the spiritual welfare of the Christian world. The (bull) is, over all, a document excoriating the French for trying to exert authority over the church's property in France. The (bull), addressed to the secular realm, was not seen in its time or any time thereafter (except by a few who insist that there is no salvation outside the Roman Catholic Church) as a statement about spiritual authority since that would put it far out of the context of what Boniface was attempting to do. His goal was to make the kings, dukes, princes, barons and other secular leaders admit he was more powerful than any of them, a lost cause even in his day! The furor roused over the document led to an invasion of Italy which at the time was ruled as the Papal States. Boniface was arrested and died a few months later; according to one historian of the era, from being so upset over losing the argument. It also led to the Avignon papacy, a period when the popes rather than rule as undisputed masters of both the spiritual and secular worlds, were more or less held prisoner by the French kings. Ever since, certain factions like to claim that Boniface was speaking *ex cathedra* (from the chair of St. Peter and therefore with infallible authority) but subsequent popes and councils have repeatedly said that the political nature of the letter discounts any real sense of an infallible statement since it was not directly motivated by the moral and spiritual authority of the Holy See or founded in the *sensus fidelium* (the common belief and practice of the faithful) which has been an integral aspect of any genuine *ex cathedra* statements. On the internet page where it was quoted it has been used to underscore a point of view which has no real place in Catholic thought.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
