Dear people of God,

I want to address the third of five statements I was given for review. This one is from Pope Eugene IV (around 1440 and the council of Florence): The most holy Roman Catholic Church firmly believes, professes, and preaches that none of those existing outside the Catholic Church. . . can have eternal life. Again, context is everything and the quote here is taken out of the general context of the papal bull (letter) which was specially addressed to resolve a specific issue in Eugene's goals: the reunification of the Catholic and Orthodox Churches. It is of limited application to the universal Church beyond the attempt to bring about reunification. If you look this up in any of the original Latin copies you'd discover that the *Holy Roman Catholic Church* is specified as being a church founded by Jesus Christ and the *catholic church* is the universal church professed in the Nicene creed with a lower case "c." I prefer to reference a collection called Denzinger because it includes the primary works in the original languages not in a translation somebody made or had made to fit their own purposes. The underlying goal of the bull makes a huge difference in how the quote should be understood. First, Eugene reminds the reader that the Catholic Church we belong to teaches. Indeed, it does and it has a lot to say about salvation, faith and being summoned to the Roman Catholic ecclesial community. But what it's teaching here is what it's taught all along: that God has established his own universal church and outside that there can be no salvation. How God draws anyone into that universal church is always God's doing. It's more often than not explained by saying that faith is not something we can develop on our own, but requires a gift of that faith from God. In other words, God wills the salvation of sinners; we don't will our own salvation. We may be smart enough once we have the gift of faith to want to be saved and do all in our power to make sure we are saved, but the initial step is always and ever the one God takes. That's a key element in religious teaching: we cannot save ourselves. From St. Paul and other early church writers, we believe that Jesus' death on the cross was the "first step" taken by God to give the gift of faith. It was present by the miracle of God's love when God created Adam and Eve, it was there by that same miracle of love when God called Abraham, and it was there by virtue of God's love when Moses led the faithful out of Egypt. It was there when mom and dad, filled with the faith God invited them to share, brought you and me to the waters of baptism and will be there when each of us makes that final decision to accept it or reject it at the final judgment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.






