Dear People of God,

Once again we find ourselves wondering what's gone so wrong with the United States – another shooting at another church, this time a Synagogue in San Diego. The perpetrator is a 19-year old, who apparently didn't pay any attention in CCD class or Sunday School, depending on his Christian heritage. He decided that the Jews are responsible for both the death of Jesus and a world-wide anti-Christian terrorist program. Both are wrong. If there is responsibility for the death of Jesus, it's a weight born on the shoulders of all sinners, regardless of their faith background. However, on closer inspection, the responsibility for Jesus dying on the cross is entirely that of Jesus because he chose to do so. He was not forced, nobody made him do it. It was an act of genuine and total love, to sacrifice himself for our sake, for the sake of the very men and women who almost hourly deny him, revile him, turn their backs on him, and otherwise weaken the moral and social fabric of the world by sinning. Over the past centuries, the “blame” for Jesus' death has fallen on the Jewish people only when Christian people refuse to be accountable for their own sin. Vatican Council and all the subsequent Popes have repeatedly reminded us Christians that we are, with the Jewish people, the children of the same God, of the same covenant, of the same heritage. Jesus was himself a practicing Jew and, as far as we can tell never, converted to Christianity but expanded his traditional faith to bring about a new covenant to which all are welcome.

As for the ridiculous claim that the Jewish people are part of some conspiracy to do in the Christians of the world, I would hope that should you hear that claim you'd laugh the person out of the room. Because we are of the same covenant, Christians and Jews generally work well together despite some deeply seated differences in how we see that covenant being played out in our spiritual and physical lives. We worship the same God and strive for the spiritual perfection of our people, but we do not seek to destroy one another. I can think of few greater sins than attempting to destroy any faith group for any reason. Some may well be led astray by false beliefs, but all adherents are men and women created in the image and likeness of God and as I read the fifth Commandment of the Decalogue, there is no permission granted to pick and choose who we will not kill. Instead, let us pray for a genuine respect for all human life so that tragedies such as we saw in San Diego don't happen again – anywhere by anyone.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
