Dear People of God,

The Easter Season is a time of great rejoicing! Ideally, all those who made their way to Mass on Easter Sunday would choose to do the same all the following Sundays of this most holy season when the readings unravel for us the beginnings of the Church we hold so dear! I was asked after the Easter Sunday Mass why we sing the triple Alleluia at the end of the celebration. A jokester standing nearby responded *because we like to sing it*, but there's a little more to it than wanting to raise our voices in thanks and praise to the Father. For the ancients, numbers were something mystical, as they remain for me, since my mind works more in the practicalities of history and language than in the tangle of mathematics (which makes no sense since history is the accumulation of facts over a mathematical expansion of time). At any rate, the Hebrews were no less intrigued by the almost magic way numbers work in combination to take on meaning than were any other ancient culture. Numbers and their values held out the revelation of the divine and of the created, of that which cannot be changed and that which is constantly changing. In a word, three was the number of the divine, and for Christians in that era, it symbolized the revelation of the Trinity, one unchangeable God, three Divine persons. Unchangeable because three is a prime number, divisible only by itself and by "unit" or what we refer to as one; Trinitarian because it obviously indicates only three, not two or four, but three. The early Church began making use of "three" for a lot of things we take for granted: the three invocations at the Penitential Rite, the three Alleluias traditionally sung before the gospel, the three "holies" sung at the *Sanctus*, the three repetitions of the Lamb of God, and, yes, the three Alleluias we sing on Easter Sunday morning! There were many more but over the centuries many were deleted. The Tridentine Mass still uses a lot of repetitions of three, but because the celebrant faces away from the people, these are largely unobserved which is why the Second Vatican Council eliminated them from the Mass we now celebrate. Of course, Patrick, the patron of the Irish who founded our parishes, made use of the shamrock to give a practical example of three-in-one. Not the clover which is a more common tri-foliolate (three leaves on one stem – I'm not sure tri-foliolates are a good representation here in North America since poison ivy and poison oak are both well-known tri-foliolates) but the shamrock. It's a tri-foliolate which has three leaves all of which are three-sided. The Alleluias at the end of the Easter Sunday Mass reflect a heritage which attaches diverse significance to the number three.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
