Dear People of God,

Thanks be to God!

For those who weren't paying attention, that's the last thing we say as we prepare to depart from Mass. In Latin, it's *Deo gratias* which points us more directly to gratitude to God for his many blessings imparted hourly in our lives. Thanks be to God isn't the last thing we are to think about and quickly erase along with everything that occurred at Mass as we hasten to return to the hectic world around us. Rather, *Thanks* be to God is supposed to be the mantra of a grateful people all week long as they do their best to live as Jesus lived. For those unfamiliar with it, a mantra is a repeated word or phrase that calms the mind and allows it to focus reflectively on something important or valuable (the Rosary, brief texts repeated from Luke's gospel. It guiets the mind to distraction so that the mind can focus on the meaning of the 20 mysteries). In the Eastern religions, a mantra is more often than not a nonsense vocable (a noise, not a word like omm) uttered over and over while for us the repetition of Thanks be to God might be the first thing we think or say as we undertake the various activities of the day. For example, Thanks be to God when we wake up since every new day is a gift of life from our God. Thanks be to God for a fresh box of breakfast cereal or a piping cup of coffee at the Burger King drive through. Thanks be to God for the car that gets us to work. Thanks be to God the line at the drive through was short enough we weren't late for afternoon hours. Thanks be to God for the paycheck at the end of the week. Thanks be to God for the electric lights which permit us to read our favorite novel in the evening. Thanks be to God for the clean sheets and comfortable mattress as we come to the end of our day. There is very little which occurs that should not garner our thanks. Even disasters can be moments of thanksgiving; perhaps that we were spared worse damage, or allowed to come through relatively unscathed. Gratitude for the Christian becomes a day-long, week-long, life-long habit that guides behaviors, relationships, and just about every facet of life itself. As I dive more deeply into the mature years (I refuse to call them golden since the only thing gold I've discovered in old age is teeth!), I give regular thanks to God that I can still see despite macular degeneration, that I can still hear despite tinnitus, that I can still feel my heartbeat and climb a set of stairs without having to dial 9-1-1! Gratitude lived prevents us making foolish mistakes, saying foolish things, or biting off someone's head and regretting it a minute later. Gratitude generates good will and engenders sacrifice, compassion, sharing and selflessness. Those all seem to be virtues worth cultivating and it all begins with a spirt of genuine gratitude.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
