Dear People of God,

Do this in remembrance of me...

This quote from the gospels is recited as part of the words of institution for the Blessed Sacrament every time we come to Mass. It was the key-note for the recent spiritual training of our Extraordinary Ministers of the Holy Eucharist. I thought I'd attempt to reprise some of what the presenter had to say, or more likely, what I heard of the presentation. Because it's part of the Mass, I suspect most of us quickly limit its meaning to the Eucharist; yet the "me" Jesus intends is all of him, from the nativity to the cross to resurrection, ascension, and second coming at some time in the future, and perhaps most importantly, to the lessons in living/relating Jesus shares with us in the Gospels. The Eucharist should encapsulate all of Jesus' life, all of his public ministry, all of his saving actions, all of his commands, so that our mind is focused on a life, not a brief moment in the Upper Room. But we might also go beyond Jesus' time spent with us on earth to his divinity and harken back to creation itself, to the pillar of fire and smoke leading the Hebrews out of Egypt, to God's word spoken through the prophets. Doing something in remembrance demands that we embrace the totality of that which is remembered and that means going beyond even the memory of a person, or of God, to what God/Jesus has done and accomplished in the world, in others, and in ourselves, to what Jesus/God expects from each of us as we tackle the hours of each day. We are reminded that Jesus' death wasn't just for any one or two of us individually, but for all – for those who believe and those who may one day believe, for those who refuse to believe and those too afraid to believe. That should then provide the impetus for our behaviors toward others because each of them was the subject of Jesus' death on the cross, the salvation of each one motivated his will to die so that all might live. We should be reminded that we're all in the same boat – a boat kept afloat by Jesus' saving actions, and which must get to its future port (Heaven in case you're not following along here), we must all work together whether at the oars, the tiller, or hoisting the sails. It's why the church refers to the *family* of humanity because we're all one, in our creation, in the salvation won for us by Jesus. And of course, when science finally catches up to the Bible that unity has been spelled out by the DNA we carry in our cells: studies in Germany have concluded that one human mother (whom we've called Eve for a few thousand years) had five daughters from one of whom each of us is descended. What we do in remembrance of Jesus goes far beyond striding up to the Eucharistic Minister and sharing at the table of the Lord but dictates our behaviors toward others, whether in the church or out on the streets. We should always remember these words of Jesus as we take the Eucharist: love one another as I have loved you.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.


