Dear People of God,

The Liturgical year has rung down to its conclusion. Ordinary Time gives way to Advent, four weeks of joy-filled preparation for our recollection of the Birth of Christ. I'm not sure why, but Advent has become a rather dour season. It shouldn't be. Unlike the people of the Old Testament who spent thousands of years waiting, we know exactly what's coming (actually "what came" since our celebrations are all based on past events) and that ought to make us unbelievably happy and ready to sing, dance, and shout out our alleluias. I think about the chant mode we use to sing "O, Come, O, Come, Emmanuel." Compared to the music we hear at Levis Commons or Westfield Mall or the Galleria for those who like shopping in Houston, it seems pretty slow and sonorous, but for its time it was really avant garde considered by many way too spicy for use in the Church! Unfortunately (at least from my perspective), we've allowed the piety of respect for God's presence to overwhelm the festival nature of our celebrations. Before I was ordained, I was the DRE and Youth Minister at my home parish and among my many duties was director of the children's choir. I don't like to boast, but when forced I have to admit it was a pretty good choir that at Christmas sang popular carols in the six languages of the immigrant peoples who settled in the territory of the parish. Many of these are songs which speak "happy" even if you don't know the language so are sprightly and up tempo. They also call for some solo work, including the familiar French carol *Minuit Chretien* which requires a broad range for the soloist which in this case was a sixth grade boy who hit the full range, held all the notes he was supposed to, and smiled when I gave him the thumbs up sign after his performance. Now, at that parish the choir loft was up high but over one of the transept wings so the soloist could be seen from the pews. After Mass, several people nailed the poor kid because "how dare you make light of the Mass in church!?!" I lost a member of the choir that day and had difficulty in convincing the lad and his family to remain in the parish. I found it difficult to believe anyone would complain to a sixth grader, let alone about smiling, that his rare talent had been well used to give praise to his God. I continue to be saddened that many people continue to think that way, smiles and joy have no place in church, a joyous noise unto the Lord has to be sung in a dirge tone, and how dare anyone think to try and teach us a new hymn that has a more lively cadence. I wonder what Jesus, whose first miracle was at a wedding reception which had obviously gotten to the point of boisterous loudness (the wine was all gone you may remember), thinks about such an attitude. I don't believe we need to throw out the organ and set up drums in the sanctuary as happened at one main stream Protestant parish near Dayton, but I do ask that we all consider the Mass as the greatest, happiest, most joy-filled experience we could ever wish to have short of the beatific vision. Make Advent a time of excited expectation this year.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
