Dear People of God,

Last winter's Wednesday evening offering at St. Pat's was focused on Apologetics. The term is a classical identifier for the more practical work of defending the faith. (You can find a lot of practical information on Apologetics by using your Formed app; unlike Kindle, Netflix, Hulu and so many others that proclaim "Get the App for FREE," Formed includes ALL of its content for free as well as hundreds of resources for every taste and interest).

I have written a few letters on how practical necessity led to logical/ liturgical actions at Mass; in many ways Apologetics invites us to learn the practicalities to explain the actions. The Church's praxis (what we do to live what we believe) in many ways replicates and makes holy ordinary human nature and what people do ordinarily.

This is easy to see if we pay attention to what we or others are doing. For example, some accuse us of "worshipping" the saints and scorn our respect for relics despite the common hobby of collecting memorabilia ("relics") of famous political and sports figures. Not surprisingly, such critics derogate our construction of shrines and our pilgrimages or journeys to them but think nothing of visiting the Vietnam Wall and honoring those whose names are inscribed there. We Catholics honor the heroes of our own past, many of whom sacrificed their lives just as did the men and women commemorated on the Wall!

We often erect shrines to honor a particular saint. There are two in St. Pat's: St. Florian, patron saint of firefighters, and St. Michael, patron of police. One in the garden honors St. Brigid, secondary patron of Ireland. There are two in the yard at Immaculate Conception, both drawing attention to Mary whom we honor as a mother, a patron, and a disciple. Shrines aren't unique to the Church; they are a human institution as can be demonstrated by a trip to Oklahoma City where no one would dispute that the Memorial Garden is a shrine. Similarly, consider all the MLB, NFL and NBA greats who are "enshrined" in this or that Hall of Fame.

Here's one you may want to go see, especially if you are in the area - a kind of duplication of what we Catholics do with the Stations of the Cross. Go to Green Bay and you can follow the "stations" of the formation of the only publicly held NFL franchise. There's even a station in the Catholic church where Vince Lombardi attended daily Mass and it's a popular secular tourist attraction!

Watch humanity and study history: you'll see the same practices and kinds of thing we use in the practice of our faith.

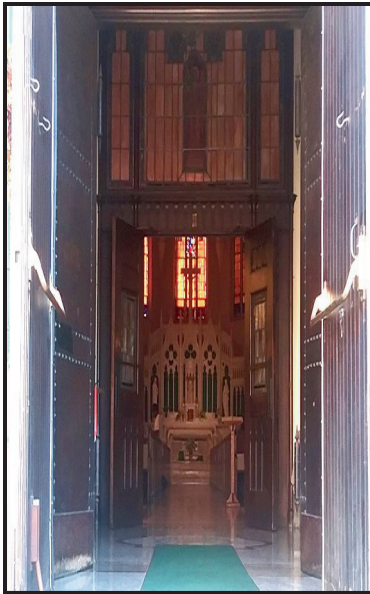

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

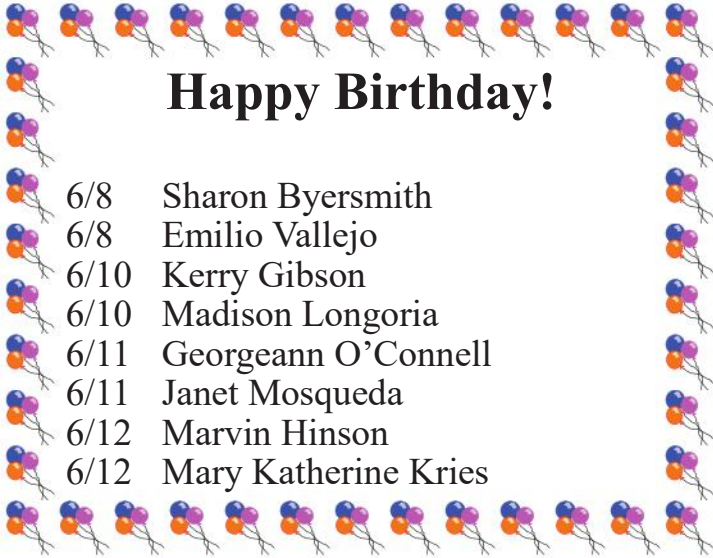

STATEMENT OF U.S. BISHOPS' PRESIDENT ON GEORGE FLOYD AND THE PROTESTS IN AMERICAN CITIES

WASHINGTON – Archbishop José H. Gomez of Los Angeles and president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has issued a statement on George Floyd and the protests in American cities that have taken place over the last several days.

Archbishop Gomez's full statement follows:

The killing of George Floyd was senseless and brutal, a sin that cries out to heaven for justice. How is it possible that in America, a black man's life can be taken from him while calls for help are not answered, and his killing is recorded as it happens?

I am praying for George Floyd and his loved ones, and on behalf of my brother bishops, I share the outrage of the black community and those who stand with them in Minneapolis, Los Angeles, and across the country. The cruelty and violence he suffered does not reflect on the majority of good men and women in law enforcement, who carry out their duties with honor. We know that. And we trust that civil authorities will investigate his killing carefully and make sure those responsible are held accountable.

We should all understand that the protests we are seeing in our cities reflect the justified frustration and anger of millions of our brothers and sisters who even today experience humiliation, indignity, and unequal opportunity only because of their race or the color of their skin. It should not be this way in America. Racism has been tolerated for far too long in our way of life.

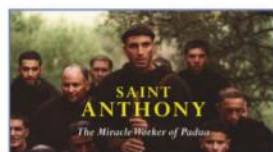
It is true what Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. said, that riots are the language of the unheard. We should be doing a lot of listening right now. This time, we should not fail to hear what people are saying through their pain. We need to finally root out the racial injustice that still infects too many areas of American society.

But the violence of recent nights is self-destructive and self-defeating. Nothing is gained by violence and so much is lost. Let us keep our eyes on the prize of true and lasting change.

Legitimate protests should not be exploited by persons who have different values and agendas. Burning and looting communities, ruining the livelihoods of our neighbors, does not advance the cause of racial equality and human dignity.

We should not let it be said that George Floyd died for no reason. We should honor the sacrifice of his life by removing racism and hate from our hearts and renewing our commitment to fulfill our nation's sacred promise — to be a beloved community of life, liberty, and equality for all.
