Dear People of God,

Over the six years I've been writing letters for the bulletin, I have dwelt on the sacraments with some frequency. They are, after all, the distinctive reality which enlivens the Catholic Church and hopefully empowers the people of God to undertake a life of service to others in fulfillment of the Great Command to love our God and to love our neighbor. Love, as it refers to God and our obligation as Catholics, is never passive. It isn't something we sit back and contemplate; there are religious orders whose task it is to do that for us. Love is always active, directed toward others from within ourselves.

If we stop and consider each of the sacraments, we might see where they ask us to look and/or what they ask us to do or achieve. For example, the activity of baptism is learning which results in growing in wisdom, knowledge, and faith the way Jesus did in the home at Nazareth. The learning never ends, though, because you may recall that baptism leaves a character on the soul, a mark which identifies us as a disciple, a word which means student or learner. Baptism is a life-long journey of discovery, growing in our knowledge of the God who is within and without. That's why the parish gave each member the access codes for FORMED, a collection of learning tools for every age and interest. It's why each of us should be taking advantage of those codes to do what baptism impels us to do, which baptism obliges us to do. To fail in the process of life-long learning may well suggest we didn't take baptism seriously and don't truly accept Jesus as the Master within who guides us along the path to knowledge of God and of God's love In fact, learning at every age is so vital and important that someone in the diocese has stepped up and will underwrite every household in every parish getting those same access codes so everyone can find something to research and take in as a means toward sharing God's presence with others. Using FORMED, you can find any number of resources on baptism itself, from the simple things children ought to know to the more advanced theology suitable for adults. If you haven't made use of FORMED, I urge you to do so.

I also urge you to consider a daily "Holy Minute" when you sit back and contemplate the presence of God within and how it changes from the way God enters into us in Baptism compared to the way God enters into us at Confirmation or Eucharist. I'm not talking about sitting back and contemplating a distant God outside who deserves adoration and glorification; we do that at Mass and while praying. I mean actually looking inside yourself and finding God there. Appreciating God present within is quite different than appreciating God up in the tabernacle. When we lock him away, we may well adore but we don't necessarily allow God to nourish our sensibility of service and love of neighbor. When we allow God to do this, we make fulfilling the Great Command an inherent part of our nature.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory at Historic St. Patrick @ 419-243-6452.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Legacy Update

A statewide mask mandate is in effect for citizens living in all 88 Ohio counties. All individuals in Ohio must wear a face mask/ covering at all times while in public at indoor locations which are not a residence. Until notified otherwise, all pastors/ administrators/pastoral leaders are to follow and implement this mandate, exercising the best practical, prudent, and pastoral judgement, showing sensitivity to those who are medically unable to wear a mask, and realizing that officiants of religious services are exempt.

While the wearing of face masks/coverings can be an inconvenience and a sacrifice, it is a charitable act that offers protection and conveys a sense of concern and respect for our brothers and sisters in Christ. Bishop Thomas is grateful for the pastoral care that our parishioners continue to receive through you and for your witness to our unity in faith shown in our mutual concern for the health and well-being of those entrusted to our care and of the broader community.
