Dear People of God,

I hope you took the opportunity all this past week to consider the beginnings you've made and how they are intended to enhance holiness - yours and that of others. You might want to check up on this by reading the sections of the documents of II Vatican Council on the "Universal Call to Holiness." (Lumen gentium 40. If you have the Catechism, you can look up holiness, around paragraph 2013 and following). Having taken a quick look at Baptism, let's move on to the second of the three "sacraments of initiation": Confirmation.

Confirmation seals us with the presence and spiritual strength of the Holy Spirit enabling us to better understand and make use of the Gifts of the Holy Spirit (hmm, ever wonder why there are seven?) These gifts are universal, present in all times and places and hopefully in some form in all human beings. In Confirmation, they take on a much richer sense of place in what we do and why we do it. This enhancement occurs when we commit ourselves to making it occur: we have to want to accept the Holy Spirit in the sacrament. Consider all the times, events, and moments that are associated with us humans making agreements, commitments, contracts, and other relationships which require us to hand over some element of ourselves to another. We begin a friendship, but it takes energy and sacrifice to make that friendship actually last longer than the time it took to say hello. In fact, most of the beginnings we undertake on a regular basis will then demand that we make some sort of a commitment to make the beginning last into the future. That should inform us that by the grace of the sacrament, we are reminded that God makes holy all commitments which engage us in long-term, or even short term, action. Did you ever buy a car or a house? Did you then undertake to pay for it, perhaps with a forty-year mortgage or a three year pay-down on that new car? Did you begin a Bible Study and attend the classes until the series was completed? Did you set out for Cedar Point and enjoy a day or more there? Did you agree to come to Alpha and then do so over the weeks long event? The commitments to accomplish those ends, and hundreds of others we probably never stopped to think about, are made holy or should be seen as holy as they reflect the commitment and energy of Confirmation.

We Catholics believe that marriage is in and of itself a special sacrament bringing the majesty, power, and love of Jesus into the bond formed between husband and wife. However, the Church believes all marriages are holy because they are so human an activity. They begin even before the wedding but certainly take on a special significance with the marriage ceremony and then demand a commitment which calls for self-sacrifice and putting something of oneself into the partnership formed by consent.

Consider the beginnings and ensuing actions to make that beginning take on a life of its own. Have they helped you see holiness all around you? Think "yes" to inspire consideration of how that sense of holiness all around you enriches your life.

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

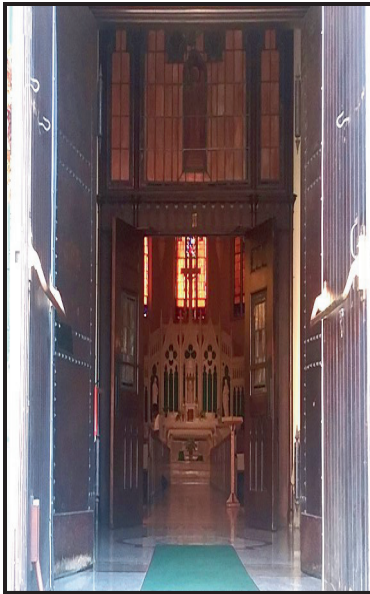
**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory at Historic St. Patrick @ 419-243-6452.

**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

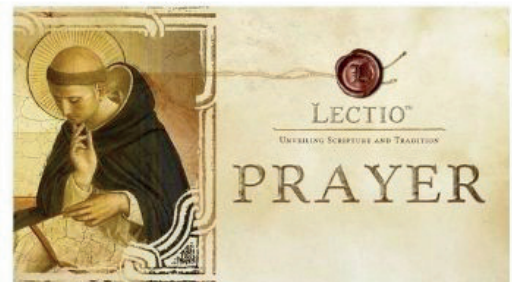

## Diocesan Priest Placed on Administrative Leave Following His Arrest

Bishop Daniel E. Thomas has placed Father Michael Zacharias, a priest of the Diocese of Toledo and pastor of St. Michael the Archangel parish in Findlay, on administrative leave effective immediately. This action was taken immediately upon receiving word of his arrest this morning in Findlay. The Diocese has been informed of the grave and reprehensible charges of a sexual nature, with minors and adults, and is cooperating fully with law enforcement. In response to this initial information, Bishop Daniel Thomas expressed his revulsion at the charges, remarking, "I am profoundly shocked and grieved to learn of these charges against one of our priests. The Church cannot and will not tolerate any such behavior and takes any sexual abuse or misconduct on the part of a cleric with the utmost seriousness. As we await the outcome of the criminal investigation, our prayers go out to anyone affected by this situation." Father Zacharias was ordained a priest in 2002 and these are the first such allegations to be raised against him. In accordance with the Policy for the Protection of Minors and Young People, while on administrative leave, Father Zacharias cannot exercise public priestly ministry, administer any of the Sacraments, wear clerical attire or present himself as a priest. Administrative leave is a precautionary measure while an allegation is being investigated. Any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor by a priest, deacon, staff member or volunteer affiliated with the Diocese of Toledo should first be reported to local law enforcement where the abuse is alleged to have occurred. To report any allegation regarding this case, please first contact the FBI at 216-622-6842. Please also report any such allegation to the Diocesan Victim Assistance Coordinator at 419-214-4880.
