Dear People of God,

Before concluding my series on the seven sacraments, I want to pause to answer a question posed by a parishioner who read about a "Holy Minute" and wondered what it was and how you'd do it. I had mentioned that many people take time to do a Holy Hour with the Blessed Sacrament and I said we might want to stop in our busy lives and do a Holy Minute reflecting on and with the Jesus who is bonded to us in the partnership created by the sacraments, especially the Eucharist. For most of us, the Holy Hour seems the easier meditation because we can focus on the reserved Sacrament without diving too deep into the Paschal Mystery and its transformational effects on us.

So, the Holy Minute I'm suggesting is a brief moment looking inward and feeling/sensing/experiencing the presence of Jesus, the very real Christ within. It's best to do this without the distractions of the contemporary world, so turn off the cell phone - no one calling you is more important than God; turn off the TV, turn off the music and create a space filled with silence, or if you're on the back deck/patio, filled with the sounds of creation. Close your eyes and feel yourself, perhaps your hand or your ears, or nose and allow that feeling to become permeated with the presence of Jesus. For example, if you focus on your hand, feel the rough, calloused hand of a carpenter, feel your hand reaching out to touch someone, someone hurting and perhaps dying who has placed all their trust in the Christ to perform a miracle. Allow your feeling to sense the power of God racing along the arm, into the fingers and from there leaping into the life of the one touched, perhaps envisioning a leper who is suddenly cleansed. Allow yourself to sense the unique partnership created between you and Jesus, savor the sensation of God's participation in your hand when it does its own work in the here and now. By the grace of God and Jesus' presence in the sacraments, you can defy time itself and be present with Jesus in the people he touched with his hands, with his voice, with his love in the past, the present, and the future. For a brief instant, forget yourself as you perceive yourself in order to be and allow this amazing partnership to reveal for you the person you have become with Jesus present in and with you.

Like anything else this takes practice because we've trained ourselves not to do it. We prefer, most of us, to think Jesus does things for others or that he's best left in the tabernacle so sensing the divine presence will take some work. But give it a try. You might be surprised at what he reveals, how you feel, and what you can suddenly figure out you can accomplish. You'll never tell anyone "God go with you" the same again!

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory at Historic St. Patrick @ 419-243-6452.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.








Lead Kindly Light
