Dear People of God,

I recently concluded my series on the Sacraments, and someone immediately let me know that there's an all-important human activity God didn't make into a sacrament: sleeping. Ah, yes; if you're a healthy adult and do as you should, you'll spend a third of your life sleeping. Stress and strain (do your best to avoid either) may lead to fewer hours of sleep, but we all know that sleep is essential to human life. However, God did remind us of its importance back in Genesis when he rested on the seventh day. My psychological studies up in Ottawa led me to theorize that the most important part of sleeping is our dreams. For the most part, sleep is meant to restore the engine of our body; there's a sixth sense at work inside the body called the visceral sensory system. It's what makes the stomach rumble when you're hungry, the jaw spread wide in a yawn when you're tired, the body warn you to visit the loo. This visceral sensory system allows the various internal organs to adjust levels even while we are sleeping so we can awaken to a new day refreshed and ready to take on whatever comes our way. While dreaming is one of those leveling experiences we can actually sense happening, it's a vital mental necessity to categorize all those millions on millions of sensory bits we received from countless cells functioning at prodigious rates all day long, feeding us taste, touch, smell, hearing and sight - and all of it interrelated in different ways. If we didn't have a way of sifting, sorting and filing this material away, we'd be overwhelmed by noon, but for the most part, the filing system really gets rolling when we sleep and don't need the active part of our working brain.

Dreaming is kind of overflow which directs us to where we sent all the information we accumulated during the day. In ancient times dreams were often interpreted as signs from the gods of our future; in a much larger sense, they are the key to memory and recall of where we've been and so could be very useful in getting us to where we want to go. As such, sleep becomes not so much an activity but a potential break from the day's experiences when our mind conjures images in some way connected to our waking hours. Thus, our dream may serve as a reminder of holiness we've experienced or failed to experience through the day and may thus be the catalyst for shaping the actual day ahead of us.

#### The Celebration of Sacraments

**Infant Baptism**: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>**: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. **Penance**: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony**: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick**: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.






