Dear People of God,

I believe the time for the faithful to stand up and be counted has arrived. My thanks to those who have faithfully been coming together to celebrate Christ's presence to us in the Eucharist. Their attendance is testimony to their belief that being at mass is worth the low risk involved. Now the time has come for those "following" us on streaming and Facebook to reconsider this choice. It's time to come home and return to the community of faith, the community of life and love. Yes, staying home was intended to avoid risking our lives by gathering to give true worship to God and receive in exchange the very presence of the divine. Early in the pandemic, this was understandable, a fact verified by alternate acceptable methods of "attending" mass. However, masks, social distancing, and modifications to other church procedures have changed the landscape. As things stand now, apparently, we're willing to risk our lives to go into the grocery for milk to lighten the coffee we're enjoying while in our pajamas sitting at home streaming Mass but aren't quite so open to being infected by attending the life-giving Eucharist. Apparently, we're more than willing to risk our lives to get to a big "members only" store to hoard toilet paper but can't bring ourselves to risk the crowd and potential infection at Sunday Liturgy. Apparently, we're more than willing to lay our lives on the line to head to a restaurant for a good meal but can find an easy excuse to avoid the sacred meal provided by Jesus.

As your pastor I have taken those same risks. I go grocery shopping, stop in at a "members only" store to find the toilet paper aisle empty. and have enjoyed dining at many of our beleaguered local restaurants. I have not made the excuse that I am risking my life by conducting Mass, which, given the suspension of the on-site attendance obligation, I suspect I could do, citing my age and several of my indicators for a higher risk of death from the coronavirus. Let's get honest for a minute. Death is real and there is a risk of dying every day from illness, accident or from someone who has it in for us. The risk at church is minimal given the protections we provide; furthermore, as I recall, should we contract the virus at church, dying for our faith is considered exemplary and would lead to sainthood far faster than being infected at any store or restaurant and subsequently dying from this disease. Your Darby family is anxious to welcome you back to worship in this beautiful setting. Let's quit making excuses and come home to the community of life, love, and redemption.

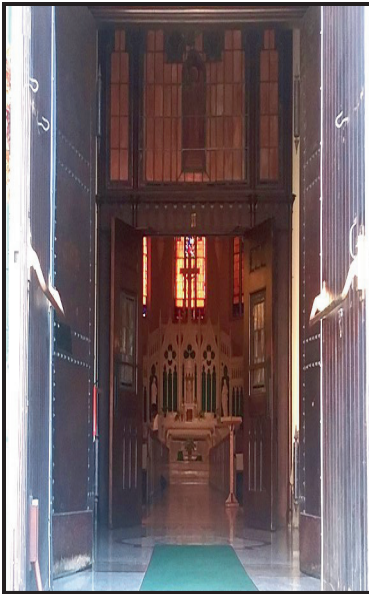

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Regarding
the Death of Officer Brandon Stalker**

With the most profound sorrow we mourn the tragic death of Officer Brandon Stalker, the 24- year-old who was shot and killed in the line of duty while protecting residents from a gunman during a standoff. We stand in prayerful solidarity with Officer Stalker’s family and friends, with Chief George Kral and the family of the Toledo Police Department, and with our entire community.

Together with all people of good will, I am deeply grateful for the selfless generosity of the men and women in uniform who daily risk their own lives to protect and serve us all. Together, may we all commit ourselves to increased prayer and action to bring about an end to violence and all its underlying causes.

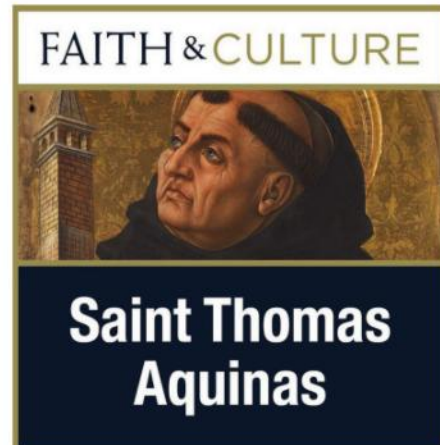
