Dear People of God,

Lent is upon us. It's a forty-day period of self-imposed penance, prayer, almsgiving, and good works in thanksgiving for the great gift of salvation offered to us by the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. As I mentioned last week, Lenten practices are a means of improving our loving disposition so we can live the Great Command. What acts of penance we undertake (beyond giving up chocolate for the forty days), what additional prayer we celebrate, what alms we share with the poor, what good works we add to those we ordinarily do are all signs of the depth of our faith and our love of the God who loves us to the point of sacrificing his son on our behalf. These actions are signs as well of our love of the Christ. If we fail to give serious thought to what we can do to say "thanks," do we then have the right to claim we're faithful disciples of Jesus?

Allow me to review the four areas of personal focus for the Lenten period:

- **Penance** acts or behaviors which counter the sinful behaviors we know exist in our lives. Most sins are habitual (they control us rather than we controlling them) so acts of penance might be developing new behavioral traits which lead us closer to perfection.
- **Prayer** the conversation with God which reveals our innermost self to the empowering touch of the Holy Spirit. Memorized standard prayers are ok but a real conversation (listening is part of the conversation by the way) can be a life changer.
- **Almsgiving** Alms is not spare change but a concerted effort to sacrifice from our need to assist those in greater need. It might be time, talent, or treasure.
- **Good Works** Deliberate actions to affect some moral or temporal good for ourselves and at the same time somebody else.

Remember that all of those four areas are meant to be founded on thanksgiving to God for the gift of salvation. That means they should be serious and not superficial. Electing to make any or all of the Lenten practices a part of your observance of Lent will bring you to a more joyous and meaningful celebration of Easter.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Snow Emergency

Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio or internet, making a spiritual Communion. When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in the geographic area are also cancelled.
