Dear People of God,

I was recently asked by a non-Catholic Christian who insisted that they had the same seven gifts of the Holy Spirit we Catholics claim are received in Confirmation. Well, I agreed - the gifts of the Holy Spirit are given to every human just by being human. Catholics are given entry into the community of believers whose lives are focused by those gifts in service to God and God's people. We don't receive what we already have at Confirmation; rather, we publicly state our intention to live the seven gifts more fully and richly by understanding what each one is, why we have been given it, and how best it can be employed in the work of Jesus entrusted to us as his faithful people.

Jesus' final command to you and me as he prepared to return to the Father was to "go and teach all nations, baptizing them . . ." That simple directive creates a missionary church, one that isn't satisfied to sit around at home and do nothing, but which literally goes forth to all nations by whatever means is available to the particular Christian doing the "going." The command is not one we just follow blithely; rather we apply the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit in order to determine the means of our joining the missionary effort of the universal Catholic Church. Knowledge opens us to our particular and unique talents while Wisdom lets us admit our limits. Understanding points us to some action we might undertake while Piety helps us to see how that action serves God. Counsel seeks out the wisdom and understanding of others in the community so that we have a pretty good idea that what we intend is really what God would like to see us doing, and so forth and so on through the entire litany of the gifts so that none of us leaps off a cliff we should have avoided!

Everybody ought to be making use of those seven gifts whether they happen to belong to the Catholic Church or not. Are you using them as God intends for you? You might want to look into them further on the FORMED platform; it's just the wise thing to do to gain knowledge and understanding, thanks to a generous gift from someone in the Toledo Diocese. Perhaps accessing the Formed platform will lead each of us to maximize those gifts in ways that enrich the world around us.

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.



A Bible Study on the Annunciation


