Dear People of God,

Palm Sunday begins the celebration of Holy Week, the most important few days in the entire Church year. During the Palm Sunday liturgy, it's customary to pass out palm fronds or, in climates where they are available, olive branches (if you watch the ceremony from the Vatican, you'll see the people holding olive branches). In the gospel read for the blessing of the palms, we see that when Jesus entered Jerusalem, the people gathered along the route and flung branches of palm and olive on the road as a welcome. That gospel should give us a hint about why we get palms and what we're supposed to do with them besides tucking them behind a picture of the Last Supper.

The gospel reminds us that the palms were a sign of welcome given to the Christ at the beginning of his slow way to the Cross and Resurrection. They're not a gift given to us, or a freebie we can come to church and take away as some sort of a prize. They are to be used to welcome Jesus, to prepare his way for our salvation. Making that happen requires us to do some serious praying and reflection. What does it mean in the 21st century to "welcome Jesus?" How can the blessed palms open us to doing something to be of assistance to Jesus on his way to winning us freedom from sin and entry into the Kingdom?

In a sense the palms given on that first Palm Sunday were the sacrifice of the people's fuel for their Paschal lamb. Firewood was at a premium in the city of 20,000 when nearly a million visitors all showed up to share the events of the delivery of Israel from the bondage of Egypt. Every scrap of palm and any other available wood was scavenged from the hillsides to build the fire pit on which the lamb was prepared. Does that give us a hint about what we might do today?

In fact, food is the primary welcoming sign in our homes. We offer guests a beverage or snack, we invite others to dinner, we go out to the restaurant to enjoy one another's friendship and camaraderie, we take a dish to a family grieving the loss of a loved one. Food is the sign of life. Perhaps that might give us a sense of what we ought to be doing during this Holy Week to truly live the message of the palm we take home.

In many cultures Saturday of Holy Week is traditionally the time for a special blessing of food to be shared at the Easter table (it takes place at St. Patrick's at 11 am). Why not take the time to put together a basket of your own and come to receive that blessing and on the way, stop by the grocery and pick up something to share with the Outreach? (We'll divide whatever we receive, canned goods or cash, at St. Pat's that day between the two parishes.) Why not consider taking something to that shut in up the street, even if that person isn't a member of the parish? Sacrifice something of your own food for the good of another and you'll be using that palm wisely.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.






