Dear People of God,

If we honor the memory of his death and resurrection by hearing his word and celebrating his mysteries, then we may be confident that we shall share his victory over death and live with him forever in God. – opening commentary, Easter Vigil.

Welcome to those who at the Easter Vigil made a full profession of faith in the Catholic Church! The Vigil Service officially concludes the Triduum, those three days which make us partakers in the Last Supper, the Crucifixion and burial of Jesus, and his triumphant Resurrection. No other solemnity or feast day comes close to the importance of these three celebrations.

I often wonder at the scant attention paid to the first two elements of that three-day celebration. When I was a youngster and my mother thought that I and my brothers ought to serve every Mass on the calendar, Holy Thursday and Good Friday were "standing room only." Stores, government offices, factories, and pubs all closed at noon on Good Friday to allow people to attend the service, but the closings washed out when people cheated and went anywhere but to the church. I'm not sure why Holy Thursday was sent to the sidelines, but today these two vital days are all but forgotten by most Christians, including us Catholics.

I'm reminded of the scriptural references to the forgetfulness of human beings and that, in spite of that, God *never forgets his people*. Perhaps we could all stand to give thought to what's truly important and pay it a bit more attention rather than get caught up with Twitter, Facebook, ESPN and a host of other distractions which may well be entertaining but do little to enhance our love for God or our neighbor and do nothing at all to win us salvation for eternal life.

There's the problem – eternal life has lost its luster, in a culture which denies death and puts it off as long as possible by coming up with creams, elixirs, pills, and supplements which we think will make us last longer. In terms of the famous "four score and ten," they may add a few extra days or hours, but in the long run of eternity they do little or nothing. Our failure as a people is that we give far too little time to considering and planning for eternity despite it being our destiny, whether taking the up or down escalator when we transition from this life to the one which never ends.

Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Vigil of Easter are a poignant reminder that Jesus the Christ gave serious thought to our eternal life and wanted it to be spent with him. His investment in the events of those three days should form a significant part of our thankfulness for his words and works if we truly hope to join him in the triumph of the Resurrection.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

You can also file a report through the Federal Trade Commission's Complaint Assistant which helps the FTC detect patterns of fraud and abuse by going to <u>https://reportfraud.ftc.gov/</u>
