Dear People of God,

Summer seems to be a time when many folks decide that Church is an option which they decide not to take. Yes, vacation is a great idea and well worth the investment in time, travel, and effort to relax and get away from the humdrum of life. I hope that none of us thinks the Church is humdrum or something we ought to get away from for a stretch! Our parish family is a bulwark of strength that we can appreciate wherever we go; we take that parish with us and can gift it to other parish communities by attending Mass at our vacation destination. There are several app's which will tell you where the nearest parish is and when they have scheduled Masses; if you have a cell phone, you can always take your sense of parish family into another church and share the faith with new families and possibly new friends, especially if you stay to mingle and meet after the celebration of the Liturgy.

I remember when I was a kid, my dad would plan our summer getaway, so the weekend occurred near a city or town which just happened to be named "Toledo" or "Swanton' (where I grew up). It was always a treat to make comparisons between the town/parish we knew as kids and the town/parish where we entered in to celebrate Jesus' presence. I can still remember the worst pews in North America at a church in Quebec, the sound of coins jingling the wrong way in an Ontario parish collection basket, the priest who "surrendered the pulpit" to a little baby who was doing its best to sing "Alleluia" without knowing the words yet. At Wilno in northern Ontario (Mom's family came from Wilno in Poland, hence Dad's decision to take us there one Sunday morning), there was a vista of miles and miles of country dotted with cows who I presume were contented and whose milk was the feature at the Ontario Cheese Museum we visited. On a southern vacation we had no idea where the nearest Catholic church was and when we asked (a rare occurrence for my father), the gas station attendant, with an interesting smile, directed us down a dirt road to a Black Catholic church where we really stood out but were warmly welcomed! These memories and the ones you can make while traveling give us a sense of the universality of the Church and its people.

Give some thought to making Sunday Mass as much of an adventure as your vacation, whether at the lake or in the mountains or just over at Cedar Point. Allow the people of a new community to invest you with their sense of faith in music and prayer and I would guess your vacation will be more memorable and far more restful.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory at Historic St. Patrick @ 419-243-6452.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Just a few reviews as we return to our rolls on the altar:

IF you are a lector, and there is a procession before mass to the altar, the lector will process up with the priest and deacon.

IF there is no deacon, the lector will remain on the altar to read the prayer of the faithful, which follows the Creed. The lector will then return to their pew. If there is a deacon, the Lector will return to their pew following their readings.

For our Eucharistic ministers, you will enter the sanctuary at the Lamb of God. **IF** no deacon, the additional EM will also approach the altar at that time.

Eucharistic ministers who distribute on the "protected" side, will wear masks while distributing. Also, for those EMs, be attentive for those who are unable to come to the altar and take Eucharist to them.

It's a scam. *Your pastor will never contact a parishioner directly with an emergency request for cash or gift cards.* Messages asking parishioners to help fulfill a need would come through the parish's or the diocese's official communication channels or be accomplished through a collection approved by the diocese. In addition, please note that neither your parish nor the diocese will ever sell or give away parishioners' personal information.

If you're not sure about a text or email you've received, <u>do not respond</u>. Call your parish office right away to notify a staff member. You can also file a report through the Federal Trade Commission's Complaint Assistant which helps the FTC detect patterns of fraud and abuse by going to <u>https://reportfraud.ftc.gov/</u>
