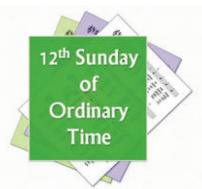

The Holy Family, with Saint Joseph  
Embracing the Christ Child  
by Carlo Maratta

Dear People of God,

This Spring, I had a brief conversation/question about Pentecost being the “birthday of the Church.” As with most things regarding the Church, the answer to that is complex. Pentecost is considered the advent, or beginning, of the Church’s public ministry given the rush to the rooftop by the Apostles to proclaim the Cross and Resurrection. That was, in a sense, the birth of the evangelization of peoples given the international audience which heard the Gospel being proclaimed. On the other hand, the birth of the community of faith can be worked back to the call of Peter, Andrew, James, and John to become disciples of Jesus at the beginning of his own public ministry. That was three years before Pentecost. On another hand (we will get more than two hands before this is over), the birth of the missionary effort of the Church can be pinned down to the sending of the Disciples to proclaim the works of Jesus and cure the sick, mentioned in the gospel of Matthew 10:1-15, or, on yet another hand, the sending of the seventy-two “two by two” which you can see in the gospel of Luke 10:1-23. On even another hand, the birth of the Church is, perhaps, also rooted in the birth of Jesus who is the ultimate Church to which we belong as “members of Christ” which you can read in First Corinthians, 12:27 and following.

So why does the tradition link the birth of the Church to Pentecost? There’s no precise answer to that, but we can consider a few of the facts which are part of the Pentecost story. First, we know that Jesus told the disciples not to rush off to start anything until the Advocate came, and that Advocate is the Holy Spirit which descended on the Apostles at Pentecost. With the arrival of the Holy Spirit, the Church is invested fully with the Trinity, the completion of the aspects of the divine which are all combined to make the Church function. And then there’s the statement of Jesus that the disciples will receive a “new birth in water and the Spirit.” All of this makes Pentecost a unique moment in the life of the Church as an active, living organism. When we read the account of Pentecost in the Acts of the Apostles, it becomes apparent that the Twelve underwent a significant transformation at Pentecost. From hiding to proclaiming, from doubt to confidence, from fear to courage and, as I mentioned above, to the urgency of sharing the Good News with the world as Jesus commanded them – and with us. As the evangelization of peoples is the primary work entrusted to the Church, the day the faithful decided to actually undertake that work can certainly be lauded as the birthday of the Church.

### **The Celebration of Sacraments**

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. 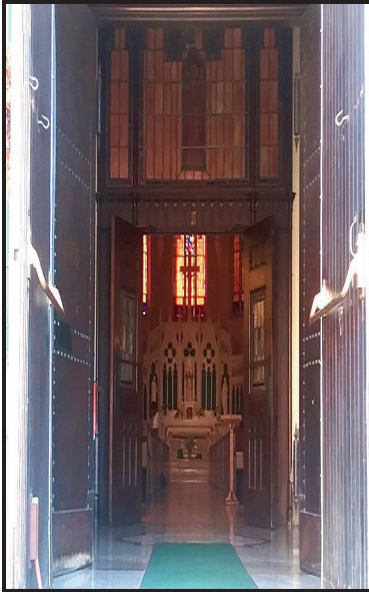
**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Just a few reviews as we return to our rolls on the altar:

**IF** you are a lector, and there is a procession before mass to the altar, the lector will process up with the priest and deacon.

**IF** there is no deacon, the lector will remain on the altar to read the prayer of the faithful, which follows the Creed. The lector will then return to their pew. If there is a deacon, the Lector will return to their pew following their readings.

For our Eucharistic ministers, you will enter the sanctuary at the Lamb of God. **IF** no deacon, the additional EM will also approach the altar at that time.

Eucharistic ministers who distribute on the “protected” side, will wear masks while distributing. Also, for those EMs, be attentive for those who are unable to come to the altar and take Eucharist to them.

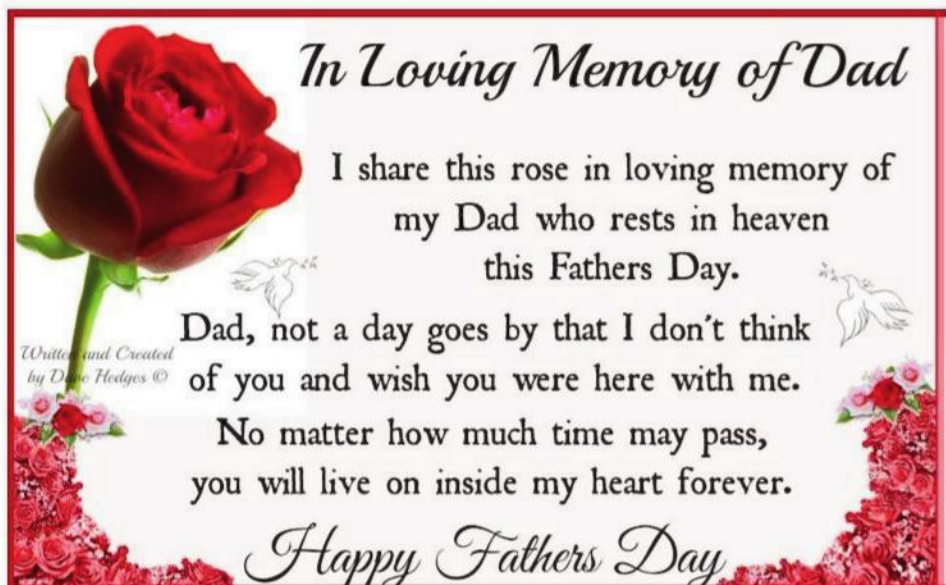
