Dear People of God,

From Msgr. Chris: It's been said that imitation is the best form of flattery, so I want to "imitate" Fr. Tony Recker from All Saints whose July 4th letter (note his reference to Independence Day) in his parish bulletin seemed to successfully address a topic on a lot of people's minds. You may recall Tony resided at Historic St. Pat's as a seminarian and was present to both parishes his summer here. I hope you find it as illuminating as I did. With appreciation to Fr. Recker, the letter follows.

I have heard from some parishioners that they are intensely concerned about the recent meeting of the United States Conference of Bishops in which our American bishops discussed and approved the drafting of a new document on the Holy Eucharist. Of particular interest is the possibility that such a document may address the situation in which politicians who actively advocate immoral activities (sin) should refrain from receiving Holy Communion. As your pastor, I find it important to address these concerns with three points:

ONE: No document has been approved. Immediately after the discussion of our bishops (which was publicly posted on the internet), the drafting of the document was approved. There has been no document as of yet written and debated over for approval by our bishops. Unfortunately, the major media outlets picked up the story and framed it in partisan language while also being largely confused about what actually happened at the recent meeting. The bishops have not banned any politician from receiving Holy Communion. I hate to say this, but experience has shown us Catholic pastors that the media almost always gets it wrong when they cover issues in the Church. Don't trust what you hear on the news when it comes to the workings of our Church.

TWO: It is ironic that much of the recent anger over the actions of our bishops is centered around established doctrine. In paragraph 1315 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, it states clearly, "Because this bread and wine have been made Eucharist, we call this food Eucharist, and no one may take part in it unless he believes that what we teach is true, has received baptism for the forgiveness of sins and new birth, and lives in keeping with what Christ taught." These teachings have been held since the beginning of the Church and reflect what we call "Eucharistic coherence" or "Eucharistic consistency;" this means that what we do ritually at the Eucharist must reflect moral reality. So, if one receives Holy Communion, one must really be in communion with Christ and His Church; anything less is disrespectful to the Eucharist (sacrilege). For the most part, these requirements for reception of Holy Communion are left to the conscience of the individual, which is only known to the individual and God Himself. However, in the case of public sin it is the responsibility of the pastors of the Church to ensure that the integrity of the Eucharist and the faith is maintained by publicly addressing the situation as to prevent any confusion regarding the Church and her doctrine.

THREE: We must resist all attempts to put our political party affiliation above our religious beliefs. We live in a time of deep partisanship and political division. When approaching political issues in this climate, we must try to be neutral and ask first what our faith teaches about the issue before making any conclusions. This is what it means to be Catholic (or Christian for that matter). In the first centuries of the Church this was challenged almost immediately as the first Christians were forced to choose between Christ and Caesar. During the Reformation, saints such as St. Thomas More and St. John Fisher had to choose between the King of England and the Church. Today, we are often forced to choose between the teachings of Jesus and His Church and the political issues of our day. As Catholics there shouldn't be any hesitation to choose Christ regardless of the consequences. Anything less is not worthy of heaven. As we celebrate Independence Day, let us rejoice that we live in a nation that respects religious liberty in these matters, and that our Constitution ensures that we may truly live our faith without restriction or coercion. May God continue to bless our nation and may we continue to love one another according to the law and example of Jesus Christ.


Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.




