Dear People of God,

I was asked recently whether the parish should reinstitute hospitality following Mass or other potlucks at the parish. You'll recall that buffet style dining was forbidden during the Coronavirus lock downs in order to prevent transmission of the virus and a few places continue to keep buffet lines closed. With the suspension of those Health department rules, and short of any of them being reinstated due to a surge in the virus or its various strains, it's ok to restore hospitality if we follow a few important "rules of the road" to respect the good health of others. After all, we don't want to contract anything, even the common cold, so we should take steps to make sure we don't give anyone anything, even that common cold.

If we're preparing something to share, we should exercise thoughtful consideration of our own health situation. Unvaccinated cooks should, hopefully, have had a recent test to make sure they do not carry the virus and pass it on with the food they bring to the potluck. By the same token, anyone exhibiting symptoms of the virus, flu, or a cold should refrain from making that favorite recipe. Those who have symptoms which presumably came on suddenly, too late to stay home, should refrain from diving into the smorgasbord until they are well. That's just good sense and caution about passing on something.

Everyone sharing from common plates, bowls, and other containers should never touch any of the food with their bare fingers. Servers should wear gloves (probably not Grandmas' finest silk ones or the flip top mittens you just bought for the Rockets' football games – I bought a pair of woolen flip tops while in Ottawa and they continue to be my favorite gloves even now, almost 20 years later) and those serving themselves should always use serving spoons which they do not touch below the handle area.

If you are nervous about sharing food at a potluck or after Mass hospitality, then please feel free to stand aside. Please don't shout dire warnings to those who are open to the restoration of hospitality; just trust that they have taken all the necessary precautions so that their favorite dish can be enjoyed by others or that they are comfortable enjoying whatever features of the gathering with which they feel safe. And remember that you can enjoy the after-mass hospitality without consuming any food or by simply sipping one of the beverages that are available. It is called *hospitality* because it is intended to foster our parish friendships so I hope you will participate in the cautious restoration of this activity.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Our prayers go out to the thousands who perished, their families, and untold numbers of people who are suffering from the devastation wrought by the recent earthquake in Haiti and Tropical Storm Grace. While hundreds remain missing, more than 12,000 persons are injured and now homeless, in Haiti’s southern peninsula, an area without medical resources in normal times.

Catholic Relief Services (CRS) is reaching out to help the destitute, distributing emergency supplies, clearing rubble, and preparing medical and mental health teams for dispatch. Growing numbers of families need food, safe shelter, hygiene, water, and cooking fuel to live.

Most Reverend José H. Gomez, Archbishop of Los Angeles, and U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops President, is making a special appeal for a voluntary special collection to support the USCCB Bishops Emergency Disaster Relief Fund. 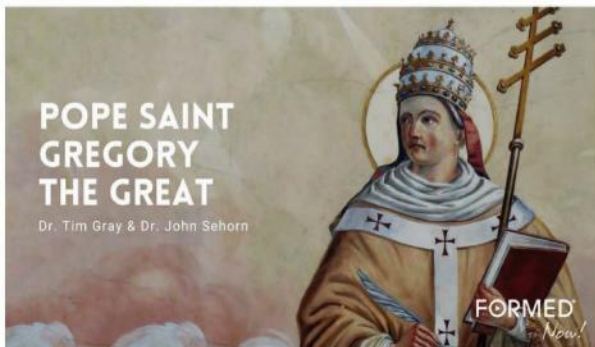

FORMED NOW: POPE SAINT GREGORY THE GREAT



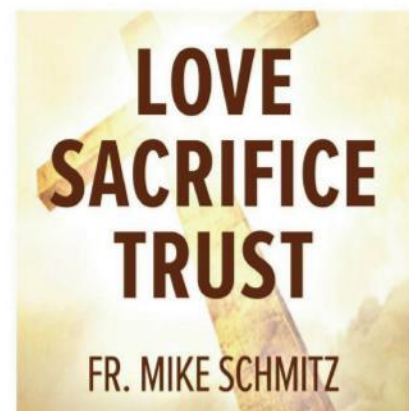
Throughout her life, St. Monica constantly prayed for the conversion of Augustine, her beloved son.
