Dear People of God,

I've done a couple of letters about non-Catholic influences in the Church and want to continue on with that topic one more weekend, although not to comment on what we've drawn into the Church from someplace else but to comment on what getting hot and bothered about influences can lead to: Schism. Simply put, *schism* is the division of the faithful by those who defect from the true faith. It's nothing new and is usually the result of somebody, or a group of somebodies, who get all hot and bothered about something in the Church they don't like or with which they don't agree and who walk away to start up their own version of "the one true Church" or who picket outside the front doors warning that anyone who goes in is entering the Halls of Doom and Destruction (There were people wearing black arms bands at the rededication of the Cathedral doing just that).

Pope Francis recently hinted that there might be a contemporary schism happening when he tightened up on the rules and regulations of the traditional or Tridentine Mass. He told us that there's nothing wrong with celebrating the traditional Mass. I wrote earlier this year that this Tridentine Mass is not the *Tridentine* Mass dating back to the 1570's because subsequent popes changed the format of the Missal from time to time (beginning in 1604) to remove of a lot of "stuff" that had accumulated from non-Catholic sources or to add innumerable feast days; for example, St. Christopher was added to the Feast of St. James, 25 July, because there was no room elsewhere! It was removed only centuries later by a subsequent pope's revision of the Missal. The Tridentine Mass is more properly referred to as the Mass of St. John XXIII; however, those celebrating this mass must also give full faith and adherence to the Teaching Magisterium of the Church (II Vatican Council's documents.) It's not uncommon that traditional Catholics inveigh against II Vatican Council, attacking the documents approved by nearly 2000 bishops in assembly with the Holy Father during that Council, especially the vernacular Mass, and go so far as to deny the efficacy of the Eucharist consecrated at an English Mass. That's a good example of schism because people who think they know better than 2000 bishops decided to do it their own way regardless of official Church teaching. Pope Francis wanted to make it clear that there is one Catholic Church and everybody, regardless of which language they use to celebrate Mass, should believe what the Church teaches about the host of all its issues.

Of course, there have been schismatic movements from the very beginning and no doubt, given human nature, there will be more in the future because some people are never satisfied until things go their way. As Catholics, we pledge each week to do things God's way, not ours. That calls for us to give our full attention and adherence to the voice of the Teaching Magisterium because that's where the Holy Spirit tells us the truth will be found in the broader context of the community of faith. That calls for the humility to become part of the community and do less complaining about the community so that the community can celebrate as one

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

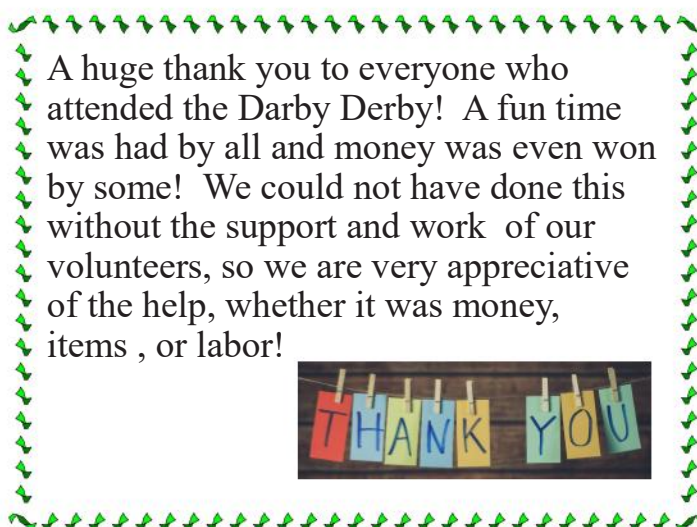

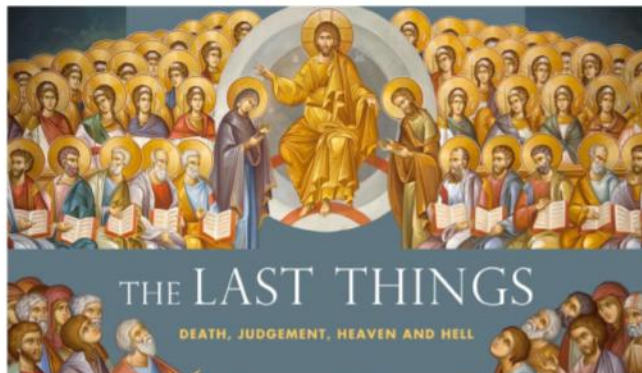

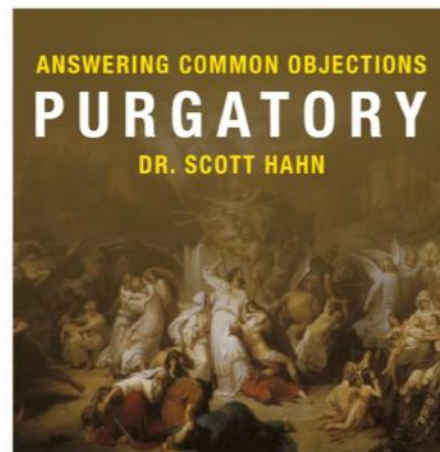
