Dear People of God,

How things have changed! "What?" you say: "The Church never changes or shouldn't" (at least according to a few emails I got about the traditional Mass a week or so ago). In fact, the Church is constantly changing, adapting to the signs of the times and a changing world in which it is attempting to share the Gospel (Good News) of Jesus Christ.

As the church came into being, it was a maligned sect of Judaism celebrating the Eucharist in the Aramaic language (that's the one Jesus would have spoken most of the time and is still the language of the Eastern Churches which are the offspring of the early Apostolic preaching there). It moved swiftly out of Palestine and had to adapt to the common tongue of the people it was converting, which was Greek, the universal language of the time; like English today, everyone spoke it. All four Gospels and the letters found in the New Testament were originally written in Greek which remained the customary language of the Church for several hundred years. However, as Greek became geographically isolated in the Eastern Roman Empire, the common language of the Church shifted to Latin because the people on the street and standing in the church (there were no pews until recent times, so there's another change that occurred as people grew more accustomed to luxury and comfort) spoke Latin or some dialect of it which would transition into the Romance languages we know.

Today we take for granted the Holy Hour spent in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. That's a truly recent adaptation. In the beginning there was no tabernacle in the church because there was no church building and the Eucharist was for the people sharing it, not for reservation and/or adoration. Early tabernacles came about fairly late as a result of the Church wanting to have the Sacrament available for use when someone was sick and dying (about the only time many people would make use of it), what we still call *viaticum*. The tabernacle was more often than not shaped like a bird and hung above the ground where mice and bugs couldn't get at it. As the Church began to acquire wealth and decided to add a lot of ornamentation to the church building, the tabernacle finally came to rest on a side altar where it wouldn't interfere with the celebration of the Sacrament of the table of the Lord. That was still fairly common in the Renaissance so if you go to Rome, you'll find the tabernacle well away from the grand altars of the major churches. The tabernacle didn't make its way to the high altar until fairly late. That's part of the reason the priest at the liturgy of the traditional Mass faced away from the people because he was facing the tabernacle of the Lord in respect of the real presence. Yes, the Church does change. Keep in mind: *Change is the only constant in the universe.*

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

ST. GIUSEPPE MOSCATI: DOCTOR TO THE POOR

Giuseppe Moscati, "the holy physician of Naples," as a medical doctor and layman in the early twentieth century who came from an aristocratic family and devoted his medical career to serving the poor. His research also led to the discovery of insulin as a cure for diabetes. Moscati regarded his medical practice as a lay apostolate, a ministry to his suffering fellowmen. Before examining a patient or engaging in research, he would place himself in the presence of God. He encouraged his patients to receive the sacraments.

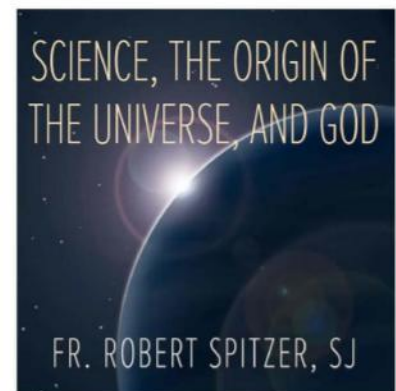
