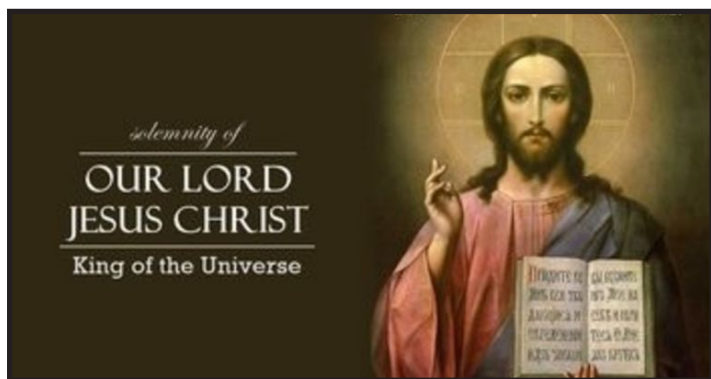
Dear People of God,

This weekend marks the official end of the liturgical year centered on the triumph of Jesus Christ and naming him King of the Universe. This past liturgical year seems to have flown past, perhaps because of Covid and the attenuated schedule in the parish. On the other hand, it has also seemed to drag as we slowly but surely build back up our regular attendance at the all-important Sunday Mass. I can understand the failure of many to come home to the Church. We've done a rather miserable job at teaching and living the reality of Jesus Christ present in the sacraments. I recall around the time I was ordained, a prominent Catholic sociologist reported that 66% of the people at Mass didn't believe in the real presence of Jesus. How sad because the whole foundation of Catholicism is the real presence of Jesus in all seven of the sacraments.

The last time there was a major lapse in belief, the Church was rocked by the Protestant Reformation which went far beyond reforming the Church and dove into denial of the real presence. As Catholics, we are supposed to put our faith in Jesus actually with and in us. As the Church, the Body of Christ Jesus is truly present and being part of that mystical body places us in the presence of the divine. Beyond our participation in the community of faith which is the Body of Christ, we also make Jesus present in accepting any of the sacraments, all of which are intended to strengthen our faith and provide the energy to engage in the mission of the Church which is to "go forth and teach all nations, . . ."

Having come of age during the heady days of the Second Vatican Council, I would have thought that many of the changes and reformations brought about would have spurred many women and men to a greater and more intense participation in the work of the Church. Ministries once the arena for priests alone were opened to the people in the pew, inviting them to assume a greater role in the parish and its mission. That excitement was, however, tempered by the Bishop who ordained me during the pre-ordination retreat when he said that the greatest problem we would face as priests was that the Catholic population had "arrived." The bishop was of a mind that with success came complacency about one's role in the Church and in a community of faith. He was troubled even then by the tendency to lionize the individual over the community. He was right about that because today it does seem like everybody is a law unto themselves and there is seemingly little real regard for others.

As we celebrate Christ the King, we ought to look deep within and locate the place of Jesus in our life, in our very being. We have the privilege of having this King within, moving and shaping us always more closely to himself and to the heavenly goal which became ours at Baptism. Take time this weekend to silence yourself to the upcoming Black Friday sales and allow yourself to be steeped in the mystery of God's union with you.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

 in your holy name. AMEN.

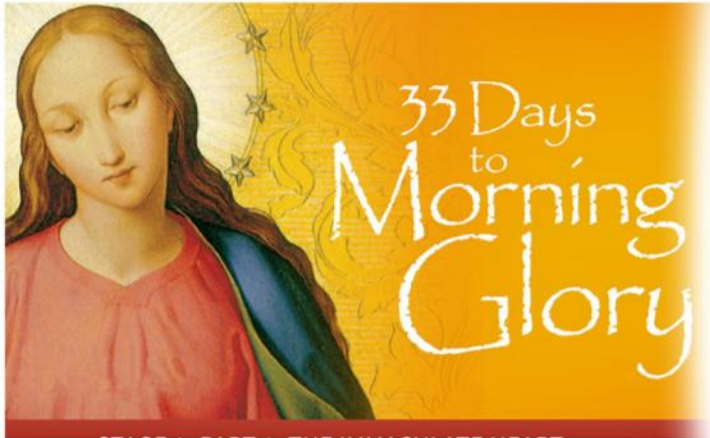

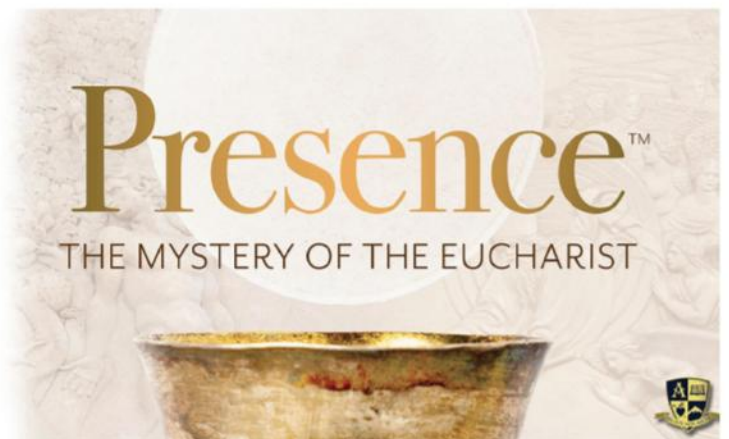

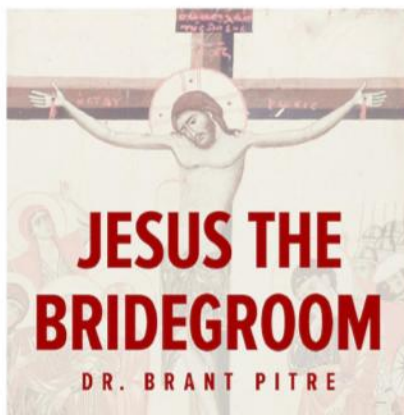
