Dear People of God,

I mentioned last week in my letter that Advent is a time for meditation and, as might be expected, a question was raised by that reference. As a kid, I learned all my prayers by heart, so how do I get out of that method and into just thinking? As an aside, did you ever notice how politicians will answer a question by saying "That's a good question?" It means they don't have an immediate answer so have to delay while they think of one. It's a fairly ordinary human trait because we generally have in mind what we want to say despite asking for questions which may well throw us off our pre-planned statement. Praying is something like that. The very invitation to pray sets off a standard mental reaction which funnels up to the consciousness all the prayers we know by heart.

Understanding that human reality, the Church early-on came up with several ways to close off the channels from memory to consciousness and let people do some serious meditation. One of the first was the chanted psalms with their plaintive, sonorous tones which seem to put us to sleep but which simply means our mind is quieting itself and going into the spiritual realm opened by the texts we're chanting. These chant tones are repetitious and that's for a reason: the repetition quiets the mind, allowing it to wander away from memorized words to the spiritual conversation we can be having with God. So, suggestion one for increasing your ability to meditate: head to Regers or some other good Catholic goods store for those of you reading this in Florida or elsewhere and pick up some polyphonic (that means no music) chants and just sit back and let things happen. I can tell you that Rap, despite its repetitious qualities, won't do the same thing.

Suggestion number two is to take out that well-worn (I hope) rosary and do it the right way. For most of us, the rosary has become a mental prayer: we hold the Lukan texts in our mind so know the Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be but never get to the meditation. Instead of mentally reciting the prayers for the various beads, say the words slowly and aloud, over and over until they no longer mean anything mentally but do provide the white noise that opens your mind to hearing God speaking to you. If you're an aficionado of Mother Angelica, you already know that the rosary is supposed to be recited slowly and quietly. Try closing your eyes while she or one of the other sisters is saying the rosary and let yourself drift off into meditation. And don't be too concerned if you fall asleep. Remember the readings we're preparing for: Joseph's dreams allowed him to hear God talking.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

<u>Pastoral Care of the Sick</u>: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Snow Emergency

Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio or internet, making a spiritual Communion. When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in the geographic area are also cancelled.

Cars left in the small lot between Eastern and Broadway will be towed if they are not moved within 10 days or permission to remain for a time due to extenuating circumstances has been given. We need to have room for those who are coming to mass.


