Dear People of God,

After Mass the other day someone stopped to ask a question: "If Latin is the language of the Church, why don't we use it more often?" There are a couple of reasons. First and foremost, people don't understand Latin. It's a complex language with subtle variations in the translation depending on several different factors which the Romans understood but most moderns, including those who attend the Latin mass, don't. I recall some pretty vehement arguments with my thesis director over translations of the official documents of the Church and both of us know the language well (I regularly translate things coming from Rome for several other dioceses where there is no Latin scholar – it's vital to know exactly what the Church says). A prime example of this is the recent deletion of the simple word "one" from the concluding phrase of the collects at Mass. It's clearly not there in the "typical" (correct Latin version provided to the experts to prepare the appropriate translations to other languages, some 200 of them spoken around the world) but it took twenty years to realize the error even among the so-called experts who were regularly reviewing translations! How well I remember learning to be a server back in the second grade and Msgr. Clancy reminding us not to mispronounce a word because what was elegant praise of God when pronounced correctly was a cuss word if pronounced with an English accent.

A second reason is that the Bishops at II Vatican Council asked us not to use it on a regular basis. It's always a good idea to follow the advice and guidance of those in authority so we tend to defer to the Novus Ordo (there's some official Latin for you). The world's bishops decided it was high time to get with it and make the Mass and other celebrations of the Church in languages understandable to the celebrants so they can actually celebrate. The Bishops were tired of people "hearing" the Mass or being told the priest "read," or even worse, "tell" the Mass. The people are an essential part of the practicing Church at Mass, not just silent sponges to take it in. It's a dialogue between people, God, and priest/deacon. They did recommend that it would be a good idea to learn the Ordinary in Latin so when we travel we can follow along at least some of the Mass. The Ordinary is the Kyrie (which isn't Latin but Greek), Gloria, Credo, Sanctus, Pater Noster and Agnus Dei. By the way, Alleluia is Hebrew. Depending on the parish, these are all occasionally sung in Latin. Do people know what any of them mean as they're being proclaimed? Probably not. They may be making the right sounds but they do not convey the right meaning because we don't think in Latin. If the presider at a Latin Mass is only making sounds and does not intimately know the underlying tonality and meaning of the text, he's cheating the people who have no idea they're being cheated because they're just as in the dark as he is. That's why even in the so-called Latin parishes, there's always that famous old two-column missal so you can more or less keep track by following the English side of the page. I can sight read Latin (that means I don't need to sit in a quiet corner with a dictionary to look up words or find the charts with all of the declensions); it was a requirement to earn the doctorate in canon law. However, I do not believe that using Latin would be beneficial for the people of God who can't follow along without the assistance of those translated pages so I join with other Latin-knowledgeable priests who don't show off by using it at Mass. I prefer to have you, my parishioners, worshipping with me.

# The Celebration of Sacraments

**Infant Baptism**: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>**: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. **Penance**: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony**: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick**: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

# **Snow Emergency**

Whenever a county/city within the Diocese of Toledo is placed under a Level 3 Snow Emergency during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, the Catholic Churches within that geographic region will cancel the scheduled Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses. Roman Catholics in that region, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass. If Masses are cancelled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass via television, radio or internet, making a spiritual Communion. When Mass is cancelled, all other diocesan, parish, or school events in the geographic area are also cancelled.
