Dear People of God,

Having begun our expedition into the nature of sin, let's start by naming the traditional Seven Deadly Sins:

- Pride
- Greed
- Lust
- Envy
- Gluttony
- Wrath
- Sloth

The list is almost as old as the Church and was widely disseminated by the 6th Century but certainly well known to most ancient civilizations. A quick reading of the Commandments of the Decalogue in Exodus and the numerous explanatory commandments in Numbers, Leviticus and Deuteronomy makes it clear that God wanted people to know them and avoid them.

Theologians warned that the interior reality of these behavioral traits was a disposition toward doing what isn't good, be it venial or mortal in nature. In their advanced state each or any of them has a tendency to lead one into actions which disrupt lives and destroy relationships. Even the lighter side of these seven traits harms relationships with oneself, with others and with God for reasons yet to be told as we venture into the realm of the Seven Deadly Sins and take a look at each one of them.

The primary effect of falling into any of the deadly sins is social isolation. As humans we're supposed to be social, involved with others in numerous different ways (A famous French psychologist identified eleven basic social groups with which any given human being will be affiliated. You might be able to think of most of them, but here's a start: family, political party, exercise class, parish and the list goes on). Sin, and more specifically the guilt associated with it, tends to make us withdraw from those social connections. That's bad news because the connections are what give us a truly human life rather than an animal one. Loss of social interrelationships, or even damaging some of them, leads to serious psychological complications. We humans don't like being alone. Sin, as one of the Eucharistic Prayers for Children states, makes us unhappy. We live in a very unhappy generation, one in which violence seems common rather than unusual. A lot of that unhappiness and the ensuing lashing out is the direct result of people caving in to the dispositions we listed above. Read the articles about

violent acts and you'll be able to see one or another or even several of the seven deadly sins. In case you can't, continue deeper into this series and you may be enlightened as to what's wrong with contemporary America and how we can deal with it proactively. That's a goal I am sure we all share.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

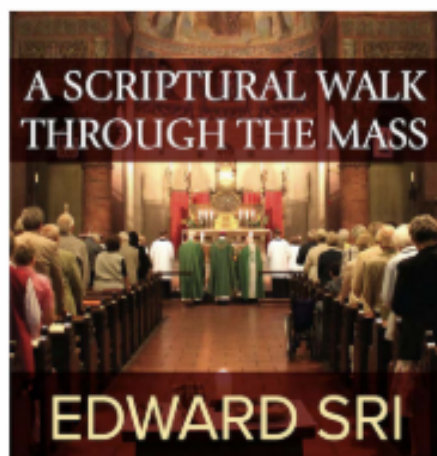
