Dear People of God,

This week let's take a look at another of the so-called Seven Deadly Sins. I think it's much easier to see that this one, as are all seven actually, is closely linked to a failure to live out the Great Commandment: Love God with all your heart, all your soul, all your mind and all your strength and love you neighbor as you love yourself. The sin: Envy.

Envy is also called covetousness when we run across it in the Decalogue. Very simply, it means we don't love ourselves with the result that we really want to be somebody else or have what someone else has.

Coveting is dangerous because it prevents us from truly appreciating our own unique character. We fail to develop those particular talents and gifts God gave us and did not give anyone else. Personally, it can lead to grave disrespect for who and what we are; we develop bad habits with behaviors that are focused on wishing rather than living. This leads us to isolate ourselves for a variety of reasons, primary among them that lack of self-love that provides motivation to get up and get involved. In its advanced state, envy goes beyond wishing we had what another has to taking it. Of course, that grave sin is called stealing and advances the disposition of envy to the reality of one of the Ten Commandments: Thou shalt not steal.

Today stealing actually goes so far as taking another person's identity, but it can also lead to destroying another person's reputation by gossiping or falling into another of the Ten Commandments: Lying.



At the workplace envy can lead to something similar to sloth but which is actually failing to spend our time doing what we're supposed to be doing to wasting that time wishing we were in that other office doing whatever we think is going on there that seems far more alluring than what we're doing. What we want is essentially an illusion and since illusions aren't real, our lives become focused on unreality.

Envy often lurks in us with regard to the family. Distracted by picturing what we think our siblings or other family members have that we don't, we waste our time moping when we could be out there obtaining by working harder or more wisely. The very worst encounter with envy often occurs at the reading of the will and literally tears families apart. Of the deadly sins, this is perhaps the one with which most of us have had some experience. The admonition to *love your neighbor as you love yourself* offers us an avenue of escape from the sin of envy.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

<u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.






