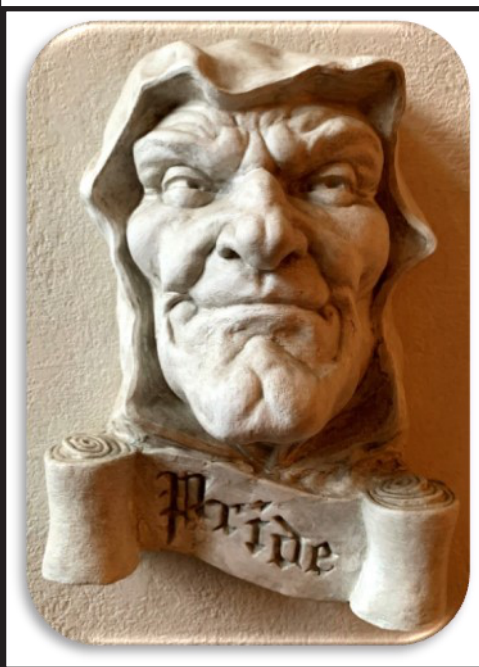
7TH Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear people of God,

As we take our brief tour of the Seven Deadly Sins, let's next examine **Pride**. Unlike envy, which springs from a failure to love ourselves, pride generally means we love ourselves too much or in an inordinate way that leads us to fail altogether to love others with some equality to the way we regard ourselves.

Of course, there's a healthy sense of pride that comes from a genuine and appropriate love of self. It's the satisfaction of doing something well or accomplishing something that has been a real challenge. Personally, it's the good feeling we get when we look down at the scale and see that those fifteen pounds we picked up over the holidays have gone away. At the workplace it's the satisfaction we feel seeing a new Jeep drive off the assembly line rather than be towed. At Church it's the warm feeling we derive from successfully mastering a Bible Study series or singing a new hymn in tune with everybody around us.

But pride can go too far. It becomes sinful when we begin to think ourselves far better than others to the point that we isolate ourselves from others due to an inflated sense of self-importance. We fail to give credit where credit is due but expect loads of credit for even the simple things we manage. We become arrogant and authoritative, damaging relationships by demeaning and devaluing them.



Eventually pride leads to Narcissism, a self-absorption that excludes others from our admiration of the self. Of course, this leads to isolation, and the loss of friends; even family can be alienated so that they avoid us. In an advanced state, pride can lead to fear and suspicion that others are just waiting to topple us from our self-designed pedestal and this can become the mental illness often referred to as paranoia.

If we look back at two examples of pride from the Old Testament, I think we can see that this deadly sin really is deadly. Consider King Saul whose fear of David led to losing his crown. Or how about Herod the Great who spent millions building impregnable fortress palaces because he feared being replaced. Historically we know his pride led to murdering five of his children and doing his best to kill Jesus so he could remain king. Beware pride, perhaps the deadliest of them all.

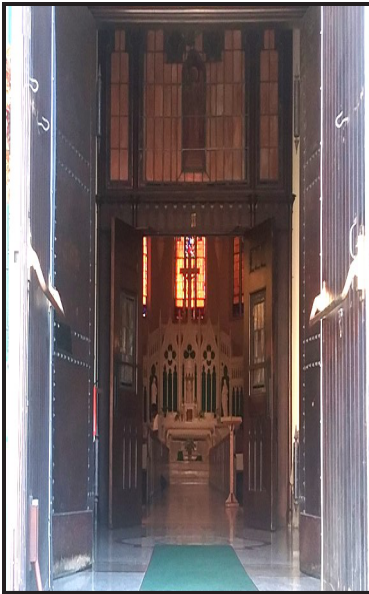
Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.
