Dear People of God,

Our excursion into the realm of the Seven Deadly Sins has taken us past Sloth, Envy and Pride and today we'll briefly examine **Anger**. This one gets a lot of play these days with a wide variety of "rages" that have crept into American culture. Where anger resides, fear follows because anger can all too often lead to deadly actions. Most of us can recognize anger and will quickly move on to avoid it. Oddly, though, angry people seldom recognize anger in themselves and blame others, often violently, for what they perceive as an interruption of their way through life.

Anger, like most of the sins we're examining, is a left-over animal instinct meant to help our animal-self survive in some sort of an emergency or another. That means God designed anger as a part of our behavioral repertoire; therefore, most of us, being inspired by God to be human and not just animal, learn how to make the best use of controlled anger, using it in the right place with the correct amount of it being dispensed.

Physiologically, anger is difficult to maintain as the muscles of our face demonstrate. Try to hold on to that grim look of the angry image and you'll quickly discover how much your entire face begins to hurt! Of course, that means anger is not an ordinary human behavioral stance. Nor is anger just being mad. A bad temper is something altogether different, but when a bad temper ignites real anger, look out: it's really destructive of the self and others to say nothing of property.

Anger, the deadly sin, is an externally directed pressure to push people out of our realm. More often than not, anger results from a lack of self-love coupled to a lack of love of others which gives us "permission" to do evil, mean things. We dislike ourselves but remember: anger is a defensive mechanism so rather than do something to discover how lovable we are, we tend to lash out. If anger has brought along envy, then the lashing out will be principally directed at particular people. We read about this all the time in the paper: spouses who abuse spouses, gangs who target gangs, and the list goes on.



Unfortunately, there are a lot of pressures today which lead people to cave in to anger. If eight out of ten people don't like the work they do to have the money they want to afford a lifestyle they crave, they'll have little reason to like themselves, perhaps thinking they're worthless and this leads to being angry, isolated and with dysfunctional relationships. Anger as a sin is destructive both to its targets and to the one acting on it.

The Celebration of Sacraments

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

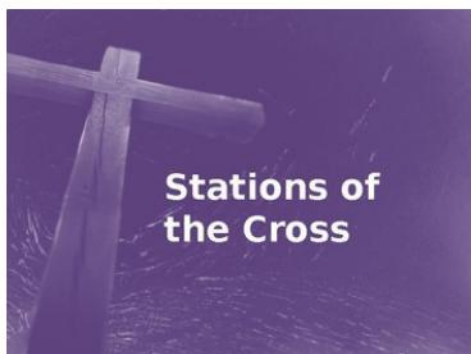
