Dear People of God,

We're coming to the end of the Seven Deadly Sins trail; only three more to go and today's entry is **Gluttony**, the sin of overindulging in food and drink.

Gluttony isn't just eating a little too much or a little too well; it's doing it to the extent that we harm others by depriving them of what we take. From the image here, it would seem that gluttony focuses on too much self-love to the exclusion of the sharing we're supposed to be doing with others, especially with the material goods which sustain life itself.

In a sense, the glutton is a hoarder but doesn't want to do the hoarding in a pantry, refrigerator or freezer but has a strange desire to hoard it all inside. Since what goes in goes out in large part the



next day, there's an endless cycle of shoving things into the forward end before somebody else can grab it and enjoy it. Because the glutton isn't careful about what (s)he shoves in, a lot of it tends to stick around and bulk up the figure.

The real sin of gluttony isn't eating too much or drinking too much; it's the failure to love others enough to make sure they can enjoy the very things we enjoy. That means the sinful glutton may well be as thin as the proverbial rail, but when it comes to sparing a few items from the pantry for the needs of the poor and hungry, the glutton will find excuses to offer nothing at all or some worthless, stale can of bread crumbs left over from three or four years ago, a useless offering given the common practice of "Use by" dating which requires food pantries to dispose of outdated "gifts." We might think of this as selfishness taken to the nth degree. Real selfishness does little to enhance getting along with the

people around us.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord: Exemption from Lenten requirement to abstain from meat

While Fridays in Lent normally are a day of abstinence from meat for Catholics, canon law provides an exception for solemnities that fall on a Friday, as the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord does this year. Therefore, Catholics are not obligated to maintain the usual Lenten abstinence on Friday, March 25. As Canon 1251 says, "Abstinence from eating meat or some other food according to the prescripts of the conference of bishops is to be observed on every Friday of the year unless a Friday occurs on a day listed as a solemnity. Abstinence and fasting, however, are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday."
