Dear People of God,

You readers know that I use this format to address parish topics and liturgical subjects. This week I'm focusing on charity, those extraordinary gifts we make to those in need. Let me first thank you for your generosity towards the relief of those suffering an unjust invasion in the Ukraine. I'm always edified by the outpouring of that kind of generosity for special needs when they arise. However, there are acts of charity which often go unmet and the Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA) is one of them as are other diocesan collections which come up during the Liturgical year.

I suspect that many of us don't realize that the ACA is an act of charity. However, when we contribute to this fund which undergirds the Mission and Ministry of the larger Church in Toledo, we are giving the gift not so much of our money but of the love of neighbor to which we are summoned by our love of God. All the funds realized by the ACA go to the actual work of the Church, not to any other need no matter how pressing.

Perhaps we don't think of the lawn being mowed when we visit the graves of loved ones at any of the cemeteries here in Toledo, but the ACA helps the funding at all three as well as at a few others scattered across the nineteen counties in our diocese. We may not be aware of the housing provided for abused women and children here in Toledo and elsewhere in the diocese, but the ACA makes them possible, relieving suffering right here at home. Many of us don't even know that Catholic Charities assists in adoption services because it can count on the ACA for funding. Perhaps we've forgotten (it's been a while since Deacons Tom and Dave went through the program) that the ACA makes it possible for deacon candidates to receive a high quality education and spiritual formation. The ACA is also responsible for the formation of the priests we all want to have in our parishes. Other acts of charity performed by those who support the ACA include marriage and family enrichment programs, strategic planning initiatives to assist parishes in their sustainability and, my personal favorite, the Tribunal on which I had the privilege of serving for a period of time.

Acts of charity are acts of love. Are any of those listed above things we ought not be doing? Can we truly say we love our neighbor as we love ourselves if we fail to do what we can to assist in these important works? For those who have made a donation or pledge, thanks, and to those who have not, consider your own love of neighbor and do what you can. I'll close with a quote from our Diocesan Shepherd, the Bishop: "As we move forward in hope, united in the love of Christ, I invite and encourage you to support financially the shared mission and ministries of our Diocese of Toledo through the 2022 Annual Catholic Appeal. This year's theme calls us to *Do Prayer, Do Service, Do Gratitude*, that others may recognize our Lord Jesus through our words and actions."

The Celebration of Sacraments

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

Historic South Initiative Home Repair Program

Historic South Initiative's home repair program helps residents in the Old South End repair issues to the outside of their home that are related to lead hazards, safety, and sanitation. The following repairs qualify:

New windows and/or doors

New siding and/or painting

Roof repair and/or replacement

Gutter replacement

Exterior asbestos removal

Once an application is received and approved, Historic South will inspect the home and determine what can be done. A grant to the resident is then awarded based on income. The average grant is \$15,000. To qualify, you must meet these

requirements:

• Be in the target area of I-75 highway to Broadway to Walbridge Ave, back to I-75.

• Be the owner of the property.

• Be current on home taxes. If not current, must make a down payment towards a payment plan and pay up to 3 months before being eligible.

• House having a sound structural quality.
