Dear People of God,

With my Spring Finance series completed, I'd like to turn to another area of concern/interest to all of us: the issue of evangelization. It's a Greek word that means *good news*, and as I hope we all know, the good news is that God loves us enough to have sent his only begotten son to save us by dying on the cross and open the gates of heaven for us by rising from the dead. As baptized Christians we're supposed to share that good news with all we meet, whether in the parish or out in the world.

For dedicated missionaries evangelization means going off from their native place to distant lands and working on behalf of the universal Church to proclaim Jesus as Lord and King. For the rest of us, it means living so authentically on a daily basis that we show our appreciation of God's saving work; such evangelization may be as simple as having a home whose decor includes signs of our Christianity such as palms from Palm Sunday or a conspicuously placed crucifix; beyond that, from time to time, our personal acts of evangelization may mean going that extra step to undertake some particular work that shares the good news with others. That extra step doesn't necessarily mean finding an old soap box and standing on a corner with a big sign asking people to "repent and be saved;" rather, it means being open to appropriate times and places to grow in our faith so we can better live it. Sadly, many of us have the mistaken view that once Confirmed, we know it all, or if we sit in the church listening to the homily, we've "done our bit for the faith." Not so.

To really live the Christian life means growing into it from many different perspectives. The homily is certainly one of them, but there are others. Bible study is among the best means of discovering the richness of our faith, focusing on one or two books of either the Old or New Testament in a structured program offered right here in the parish or perhaps at a neighboring parish. The insights of the moderator added to the work of the Spirit inspire those attending and bring out the underlying truth of the Scriptures in a way that helps us live a more practical and therefore more visible Christian life.

Bible study isn't always reading the Bible but may include the reasoned responses of the Church to what the Bible has revealed. For example, we might find some genuine and refreshing good news in looking at the Cardinal Virtues, the sacred liturgy, or the seven sacraments, all of which explain why we live the way of the true Christian. There are a number of excellent programs we might turn to on FORMED, the Catholic platform that provides a wealth of information which is easy to digest and then live out in a way that allows each of us to radiate the Good News of Jesus Christ to the world around us. Whenever we find ways to enrich our roles as "missionaries" of our faith, we are choosing to engage in personal evangelization whose effects may be personally positive or socially enhancing.

### **The Celebration of Sacraments**

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory at Historic St. Patrick @ 419-243-6452.

**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

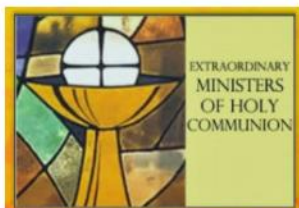

## Historic South Initiative Home Repair Program

Historic South Initiative's home repair program helps residents in the Old South End repair issues to the outside of their home that are related to lead hazards, safety, and sanitation. The following repairs qualify:

- New windows and/or doors
- New siding and/or painting
- Roof repair and/or replacement
- Gutter replacement
- Exterior asbestos removal

Once an application is received and approved, Historic South will inspect the home and determine what can be done. A grant to the resident is then awarded based on income. The average grant is \$15,000.

To qualify, you must meet these requirements:

- Be in the target area of I-75 highway to Broadway to Walbridge Ave, back to I-75.
- Be the owner of the property.
- Be current on home taxes. If not current, must make a down payment towards a payment plan and pay up to 3 months before being eligible.
- House having a sound structural quality.

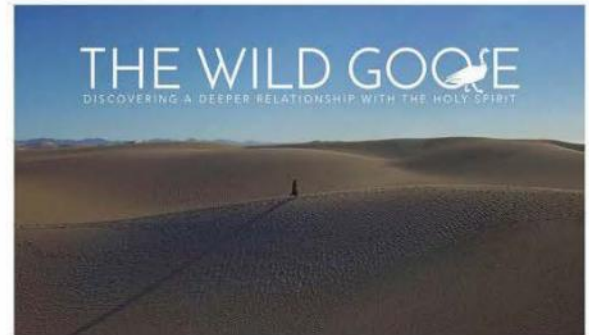
