Dear People of God,

This week we celebrate Independence Day. Much of the luster of the day has been allowed to evaporate by changing its general name to *The Fourth of July*. Yes, it is the fourth day of the seventh month, but we risk losing the real sense of why we celebrate if the day off, hot dogs, baseball games and fireworks are the only reason we know and understand the Fourth of July.

A month ago we made note of Memorial Day; Independence Day is inextricably linked to that earlier celebration. Independence Day is the capstone of an eight-year war in which thirteen of the English colonies in North America fought to gain their liberty but ended up demanding their independence. When the war began in 1775, the goal was to be admitted to full English citizenship with the legal right to elect members of the central government and take part in the political discourse which made the laws, especially those laws which affected taxes. That's *liberty* – the political and social connections which permit citizens to participate fully. Without liberty, the right to full participation, no one is truly free. When Parliament refused to grant liberty, American colonists took matters into their own hands and on 4 July 1776, transformed their goal from obtaining liberty to creating a new nation in which they would have what they craved, the right to full participation. From July of 1776 until 1783 when the Treaty of Paris recognized the existence of the United States of America, the war turned on this new demand – the demand of independence to forge their own way into the future as free men and women.

What they had been denied would be given to them not by some foreign power and not even by the colonial Congress but by the very God who had created them. Real liberty lies in the social and spiritual connections which bind a people under the aegis of God's almighty power. Our founders understood that and wrote it into the documents of independence and nationhood. We would be remiss if we failed to understand that same necessary font of independence and liberty: God Almighty.

I invite you as part of the day to tune in to one or another of the many radio and television stations which will feature a reading of the Declaration made by those who wanted you to have both independence and liberty. Take to heart the words that represent the sacrifice of upwards of 70,000 men and women, over 20,000 of them as prisoners of war, who paid the ultimate price for your day off, hot dogs, baseball games and fireworks. Above all, never forget that real freedom and liberty are God-given gifts which cannot be taken away from you.

### ***The Celebration of Sacraments***

**Infant Baptism:** The Sacrament of Baptism is regularly celebrated on Sunday during or after the Eucharistic Liturgy. Registered parishioners are asked to arrange for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** RCIA is the process of growing in your faith and love of God. Weekly gatherings take place from September until Easter. If you are interested in learning about Catholicism and joining us please call Deacon Tom at the rectory at Historic St. Patrick @ 419-243-6452.

**Penance:** The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday at IC, 9:30 a.m. at HSP and 10:30 a.m. at IC every Sunday or by appointment.

**Matrimony:** Anyone planning to be married must contact the parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a priest or deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

**Pastoral Care of the Sick:** When a parishioner is admitted to the hospital, nursing home, or confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office. Parishioners are ready to visit and to bring Holy Communion. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick.

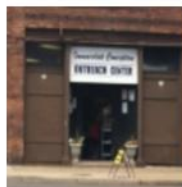

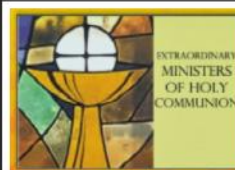

### The Community Care Free Medical Clinic




**To protect the staff, the staff will wear full personal protective equipment. We ask that all patients wear facemasks and maintain social distancing.**
